## EDITORIAL

Dear All,

Let us look at the research training component of health science education under KUHS. We have undergraduate and postgraduate courses apart from a PhD program. Post graduate programs include a mandatory research project wherein the trainees are expected to submit a research report before their final year examination. This research task allows trainees to learn certain basic research skills like critical appraisal of published research, identification of gaps in the existing knowledge base and formulation of a research question. Apart from these, the trainees are also required to learn basic research methodology and scientific writing skills. Though mandatory, these activities are not carried out very well by many.

We have to look beyond these basic requirements. Let us consider building excellence in research. There are other important questions that do not get enough attention. How can we identify future researchers from our trainees? Let us reframe the question. If we do not identify them during their undergraduate training, how can we support them to become good researchers?

Can we consider spotting research talent as part of the work of the faculty members and administrators? Undergraduate training is the ideal time to do it. If we agree on this, then this indeed is an important responsibility of the institution.

Let us look at efforts to build research capacity during undergraduate medical education. This editorial focuses on Short Term Studentship (STS) of Indian Council of Medical Research. Please see the ICMR website for the announcements in this regard. KUHS recently organized two online meetings about STS. One was for students doing MBBS and BDS courses. They are eligible to apply for STS. The second online meeting was meant for the faculty members. We are not considering STS as a goal, but we see it as an opportunity to identify students with research talent and create an ecosystem which promotes research in the institutions affiliated to KUHS. The online meetings held on 8th and 12th of May 2025 herald a new beginning. We have initiated a new ongoing program designated as "Research Capacity Building for Undergraduates (ReCaB:UG)."We will have more programs now onwards.

As we focus on STS let us be clear on two things.

- 1. We should not limit ourselves to encouraging MBBS/BDS trainees to apply for STS 2025. This is an ongoing ICMR fellowship which is available every year. So let us effect changes in the research infrastructure of the institution to identify and motivate talented students to apply for STS in the years to come and to participate in research projects.
- 2. KUHS had announced a Research Appreciation Award for undergraduate trainees in 2024. The formal call for Research Appreciation Awards (ReApAw) 2025 is now open. Please see the KUHS website. Please note that this award is open for all undergraduate trainees of KUHS.

### **Report of Grant Writing Workshop for Ayurveda Faculty**

The Academic Staff College organized a two – day (from 20<sup>th</sup> May 2025 to 21<sup>st</sup> May 2025) workshop on "Grant Writing" for Ayurveda Faculty. The programme focused on various aspects of putting together a grant – worthy research proposal including the various stages from identifying a need or gap and formulating a research question that can be expanded to a competitive research proposal. The Classes were conducted at the Academic Staff College Block (Vigyan Bhavan), KUHS Head Quarters Thrissur.



Faculty including researchers from across the state worked along with the participants providing hands – on learning opportunities, enabling them to write a proposal after identifying a funding source. The workshop will ultimately result in improved research opportunities with funding. The major objectives of the programme was:

- 1. To discuss the various steps formulating a research proposal
- 2. To enable participants to develop a research idea and to formulate competitive grant worthy proposals utilizing newer techniques.
- 3. To empower the faculty to mentor other researchers in their institutes and form research teams capable of writing good research proposals in sync with the requirements of the funding agency

The program was inaugurated by The honourable Vice Chancellor Prof. Dr. Mohanan Kunummal and he addressed the participants. Pro-Vice chancellor, Prof Dr. Vijayan C P., Prof Dr. Gopakumar, Registrar felicitated the gathering. Dr. V V Unnikrishnan welcomed the audience and Prof Dr. Deepa, Dean Ayurveda proposed the vote of thanks. A total of 27 participants attended the workshop. The participants had hands on exercise on grant writing and they were divided into different groups and they presented their group activity reports. The resource persons assed the work and gave them feedback on each of the proposals. Each participant was instructed to prepare a grant writing proposal based on the lesson learned from the work shop and to submit for evaluation. All the participants were given the certificate after the evaluation of the proposal submitted by them
