1.4	<p>Eligibility</p> <p>i. To be eligible for admission, a candidate shall have obtained:</p> <p>Full time Regular Bachelor's degree in any one of the following from an institution recognized by respective council where applicable, and is affiliated to KUHS –viz., MBBS, BDS, BAMS, BHMS, BUMS, B.Sc Nursing (Basic or Post basic) B. Pharm, B.Sc.in Allied Health Sciences, or from any other university established under law considered equivalent thereto by KUHS and shall have a minimum of 50% marks in all the years of the University examination of the course. The candidate shall have obtained permanent registration in the respective state council where applicable.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Or</p> <p>ii. Full time Regular Bachelor degree in science, Arts, Commerce, Law, Engineering or Management conducted by any recognized University in Kerala or equivalent there to as recognized by any university in Kerala, having at least 50 % aggregate of marks in all the years of university examination of degree course.</p> <p>iii. In case of the Grade system, Grade to percentage of marks conversion scheme obtained from University shall be submitted along with the application.</p> <p>iv. Usual relaxation of marks in the qualifying examination for SC/ST and SEBC candidates as fixed by the competent authority</p> <p>v. Candidate shall be an Indian citizen unless otherwise exempted</p> <p>vi. Candidate shall be medically fit to undergo the course.</p>
1.4	<p>Medium of instruction: The medium of instruction shall be English</p>
1.5	<p>Course outline The course of study enhances student's knowledge and skills in several major categorical areas of hospital administration. The MHA course provides advanced skills for practicing as a hospital administrator. It is a two-year (four Semesters) professional Post Graduate Degree course comprising fifteen papers and 45 days of project work training in reputed Hospitals. The total course duration is 3070 hours. There will be two internal examinations and one pre-final examination conducted by the Institutes/Colleges and one university examination at the end of each semester. 960 hrs of clinical training included in the course duration.</p>
1.6	<p>Duration: The duration of the MASTER OF HOSPITAL ADMINISTRATION (M.H.A.) course shall be 2 years (4 Semesters) on a full-time basis. No candidate shall join any other course of</p>

	study or appear for any other examination in this university or any other university during the period of study. The maximum period to complete the course shall not exceed 4 years (double the duration of course)																								
1.7	<p>Mode of selection to the course</p> <p>The selection of students for the course shall be made based strictly on merit as decided by the competent authority approved by the Government of Kerala/Kerala University of Health Sciences.</p> <p>50% of Govt. seats are reserved for professional stream, 25 % (4 years and above courses) science, including BCA (less than 4 years) and 25% for arts, commerce and management graduates. If sufficient candidates are not available in any category, the vacant seats will be filled from the available category according to the normal criteria.</p>

Teaching:

To start the course: 01 Professor, 01 Associate professor, 01 Asst professor and two lecturers are compulsory.

Lecturer:

Qualification: Master of Hospital Administration/ Hospital Management or M.Sc. in Hospital Management/Hospital Administration from an institution affiliated to university established under law or MD – Hospital Administration degree from an institution, recognized by the Medical Council of India.

Assistant Professor

Qualification and experience: The qualification required shall be that of a lecturer. The experiences required shall be 3 years of full-time teaching experience as a lecturer for a full-time Masters Course in Hospital Management/ Hospital Administration or equivalent affiliated to a university established under law.

Associate Professor

Qualification and experiences: Master of Hospital Administration/Hospital Management or MSc Hospital Management/Hospital Administration or M D Hospital Administration from an institution affiliated to university established under the law + PhD* with 2 years of full-time teaching experience as Assistant Prof. (total 5 years of teaching experience) for full-time Masters Course in Hospital Management/ Hospital Administration or equivalent affiliated to a university established under law.

Professor

Master of Hospital Administration/Hospital Management or MSc Hospital Management/ Hospital Administration or M D Hospital Administration from an institution affiliated with a University established under the law with + PhD* (5 years Moratorium for PhD) with 5 years of full-time teaching experience as an Associate Professor (total of 10 Years of teaching experience) for full-time Masters Course in Hospital Management/ Administration or equivalent affiliated to a university established under law.

Principal

Master of Hospital Administration/Hospital Management or MSc Hospital Management/ Hospital Administration or M D Hospital Administration from an institution affiliated to university established under law with 5 years' full time teaching experiences as Professor (total 15 Years of teaching experience) for full time Masters Course in Hospital Management/ Administration or equivalent affiliated to a university established under law

**Considering the scarcity of availability of staff with a PhD, a moratorium for 5 years can be given.*

Experience: Only full-time faculty experience in MHA/MSc HA/MSc HM/MHM courses from institutions affiliated with KUHS or from universities established under law only will be counted as core faculty experience for the MHA course.

An eligibility certificate from KUHS is mandatory for appointment as faculty for candidates who have completed their course from another university.

Core faculty should have an MD (HA) / MHA/MHM/M.Sc.(HM)/ (HA) MPhil HSSM from an institution affiliated under law. The Professor, Associate Prof & Asst. Prof can only guide the students for the project work, and the Professor and Associate Prof shall be the examiners for the viva voce.

The maximum number of faculty could be guided at a time is limited to five

3. MINIMUM STANDARD REQUIREMENTS (MSR) TO START THE MHA COURSE

3.1	LAND FOR THE INSTITUTION.
3.1.1	<i>Ownership of land:</i> The Hospital, Clinical, Academic and hostel facilities should be owned by the same management. Other forms of hospital/College facilities like those governed by any other management or charitable society or by any form of memorandum of understanding may not be permitted usually for the conduct of MHA courses.
3.1.2	<i>Area required:</i> Municipality & Corporation Limit – 2 Acre Other Areas – 3 Acre
3.1.3	<i>Single/Multiple:</i> Single or multiple
3.1.4	<i>Distance between plots:</i> <i>Not applicable</i>
3.1.5	<i>Certificates from local authorities:</i> Submit certificates from local authorities
3.1.6	<i>Distance from teaching institution:</i> Parent Hospital should be preferably within the same campus or 15 km from the institution by road.
3.1.7	<i>Availability of water:</i> Adequate and safe continuous drinking water facilities must be provided for staff and students. Also should provide continuous water supply to the Academic block, Hospital, Hostels etc.
3.1.8	<i>Availability of electricity:</i> There shall be continuous power supply round the clock with generator facility, provided to the Hospital, College, Hostels and all other infrastructure areas.
3.1.9	<i>Availability of public conveyance:</i> Good public transport system should be available at the campus or at a maximum of 500 meter distance from the Institute.
3.1.10	<i>Waste disposal:</i> Adequate waste disposal measures should be taken as per the Govt .norms.
3.1.11	<i>Permission of Pollution Control Board:</i> Submit the permission letter from the pollution control board
3.1.12	<i>Playground:</i> Shall be shared with other courses in the Institute/College.
3.1.13	<i>Vehicles for transportation: Own/tie-up</i> 1. Minibus -1 (Min of 30 seats) 2. Car- 1 (principal)
3.1.14	<i>Parking area:</i> Adequate parking space shall be made available for parking of institutional vehicles, vehicles of staff, students and visitors/ parents
3.2	Infrastructure for the college
3.2.1	<i>Total plinth area required:</i> 10000 sq.ft. The institution shall be housed on the campus

3.2.2	<p>Approved plan for the building:</p> <p>Shall be submitted along with the application. Attested site plan and Building plan including hostels, playground and administrative block approved by the Local Self Government</p>
3.2.3	<p>Lecture halls with teaching aids:</p> <p>Two numbers 800 Sq. ft classroom. It shall be arranged to seat 30 students with proper ventilation, lighting system, electricity supply, audio-visual teaching aids including LCD/digital board, fans or coolers and a comfortable sitting arrangement, preferably theatre type. There should be built-in black/green/white / digital boards. There should be a desk/dais /a big table and a chair for the teacher and racks/cupboards for keeping aids or any other equipment needed for the conduct of classes. (For 10 seats 400 sq ft, 20 seats 600 sq ft, 25 seats 700 sq ft and 30 seats 800 sq ft)</p>
3.2.4	<p>Anatomy and Physiology lab: a well-equipped lab with charts, models and mannequins of a minimum 900 sq ft area for every 30 students.</p> <p>This facility may be shared with other courses in the institute.</p>
	<p>Library</p> <p>Minimum of 900 sq m, well-lighted and ventilated preferably Air conditioned. It shall have a comfortable seating arrangement with chairs having backrests & armrests and separate tables. Books and Journals related to the core, basic subjects of the courses conducted by the institution shall be available.</p> <p>A minimum of 300 titles (minimum 200 to start the MHA Course) and a minimum of 1800 books and every year minimum of 50 new editions/ titles are to be added.</p> <p>Minimum 3 specific subject-related Journals/periodicals and 2 newspapers.</p> <p>A sufficient no of computers with multimedia support shall be available for the students. Adequate scanners, printers and photocopiers also shall be made available. Separate rooms/ cubicles for the Librarian shall be available.</p>
3.2.5	<p>Conference hall (minimum 1000 sq.ft) with audio-visual system including LCD</p> <p>This facility may be shared with other courses in the institute.</p>
3.2.4	<p>Examination hall with confidential room:</p> <p>The examination hall should meet the requirements specified by KUHS from time to time.</p> <p>Availability of hall/halls of the required size to accommodate all the Regular and supplementary candidates attending the examination at a time. The hall/halls shall have sufficient facilities like availability of light, drinking water, fan/air conditioner, attached toilet etc.</p> <p>Availability of a confidential room attached to the examination hall with two numbers each of desktop computers, printer/digital copier/multi-functional office machine, UPS and Internet connectivity (2 No., NME-ICT/NKN Optical fibre internet connection, VPN Setup equipment) all in working condition. In addition to this, the room shall also be equipped with fax, and landline phone facilities, all in working condition and supported by Power Generator. Surveillance Camera system of the required specifications in working condition. Communication Signal jammer of the required specification in working condition</p>

3.2.5	<p><i>Auditorium/Multipurpose hall:</i></p> <p>1500 sq.ft to accommodate 200 people</p> <p>It shall be shared with other courses in the institute.</p> <p>Shall be spacious enough to accommodate the full strength of students, so that it can be utilized for hosting functions of the college, educational conferences/workshops and examinations.</p> <p>It should be well-ventilated and have a proper lighting system.</p> <p>It should have a proper stage with green room facilities.</p> <p>There should be arrangements for the use of all kinds of basic and advanced audio-visual aids</p> <p>This facility may be shared with other courses in the institute.</p>
3.2.6	<p><i>Common room for Boys & Girls:</i></p> <p>A minimum of 300 sq ft of two common rooms should be provided- one for male students and one for female students with sufficient seating arrangements, cupboards, lockers, cabinets, built-in –shelves and racks should be provided in all the common rooms</p> <p>Toilet and hand washing facilities should be made available in each room.</p>
3.2.7	<p><i>Central Store</i></p> <p>A separate store room should be provided to accommodate the equipment and other inventory articles which are required in the laboratories of the college. This room should have the facilities for proper and safe storage of these articles and equipment like cupboards, built-in shelves, racks, cabinets, and furniture items like tables and chairs.</p> <p>This room should be properly lighted and well-ventilated</p>

An Independent telephone facility is a must for the HOD office with an intercom facility connected/linked to the hospital and hostel and a computer with an internet facility. • There should be minimum 450 sq ft. staff rooms in proportion to the number of teaching faculty with gender-specific toilets.

3.4	<p>HOSTELS</p> <p>Shall full fill criteria have specified for approval of Hostels</p> <p>A separate Hostel for Boys and Girls as per the approved plan shall be constructed with the following facilities.</p> <p>Minimum 50 sq ft dwelling space per student to be maintained with cot, table, chair, cloth stand and storage facility as Single/Double/Triple Room</p>

Master of Hospital Administration/Hospital Management or MSc Hospital Management/ Hospital Administration, M Phil HSSM or M D Hospital Administration from an institution affiliated with a University established under the law with PhD (5 years Moratorium for PhD) with 5 years of full-time teaching experience as an Associate Professor (total of 10 Years of teaching experience) for full-time Masters Course in Hospital Management/ Administration or equivalent affiliated to a university established under law.

Master of Hospital Administration/Hospital Management or MSc Hospital Management/ Hospital Administration or M D Hospital Administration from an institution affiliated to university established under law with 5 years full time teaching experiences as Professor (total 15 Years of teaching experience) for full time Masters Course in Hospital Management/ Administration or equivalent affiliated to a university established under law

Experience: Only full-time faculty experience in MHA/MSc HA/MSc HM/MHM/MBA (Hospital Administration) courses from institutions affiliated with KUHS or from universities established under law will be counted as core faculty experience for the MHA course.

Core faculty should have an MD (HA) / MHA/MHM/M.Sc.(HM)/ (HA) MPhil HSSM from an institution affiliated under law. The Professor, Associate Prof & Asst. prof can only guide the students for the project work and Professor & Associate Professor shall be an examiner for the viva voce.

The maximum number of faculty could be guided at a time is limited to five

To start the course: 01 Professor, 01 Associate professor, 01 Asst professor and two lecturers are compulsory
