A 26-year-old male presents with systemic symptoms including fever, malaise, fatiguability, night sweats, pruritus, significant weight loss, and generalized lymphadenopathy (cervical, axillary, and inguinal). Examination reveals discrete, non-tender, rubbery lymph nodes, moderate anemia, hepatosplenomegaly, and no local inflammatory signs. The patient is emotionally detached, showing aversion to company, and reports overindulgence in masturbation.
 - a) What is the most likely diagnosis based on the clinical presentation?
 - b) What further investigations are required to confirm the diagnosis?
 - c) Suggest a comprehensive treatment plan, including Homoeopathic management and dietary recommendations.
 - d) Repertorise the case using Kent's Repertory to identify the most suitable Homoeopathic remedy. (4 + 5 + 5+6 = 20)

2. A 35-year-old female presents with unintentional weight loss of 10 kg over the past 6 months. She reports fatigue, increased appetite, and occasional palpitations. She denies fever, night sweats, or significant dietary changes. On examination, she appears anxious, has a resting tachycardia (pulse 110 bpm), and a slight tremor of the hands. Her thyroid gland is diffusely enlarged and non-tender. Give the Probable differential diagnosis and homoeopathic approach in the management.
3. Give the differential diagnosis of Sleep disorders. How you will manage with repertory.
4. Prepare a note on Erectile dysfunction. Explain the modern management, important homoeopathic medicines with specific indications and rubrics.
5. General management and Homoeopathic approach in Vitamin and Mineral deficiency.
