Foreword



Health care is undergoing fundamental change from solely treating acute illness to focusing on a person's whole needs for wellness—where physical health, mental health and social supports are explored—involving a team of health care professionals, including doctors, nurses, health specialists and others. In this scenario, Kerala University of Health sciences has emerged as a pioneer institution in creating the team of health care professionals required for maintaining the wellness of human beings.

We have had another fruitful year, during which sixteen (16) new colleges were affiliated during the year. This included 1 Medical college, 7 Paramedical colleges, 6 Nursing colleges and 2 Pharmacy colleges. With this, the University now has a total of 296 affiliated colleges.

Ever since the Establishment of Kerala University of Health Sciences, it has been striving hard for achieving one of its basic objective – the timely conduct of Examinations and declaration of results so that students would not lose time during the period of a Course. Examinations were continued to be conducted successfully in several undergraduate, postgraduate and super-specialty courses with promptness, maintaining absolute confidentiality, both during the examinations and evaluations, and effectively preventing misdemeanours of any kind.

During the year under review, the University conducted 266 regular examinations and 746 supplementary examinations. All the examinations were completed in the, by now well accepted, flawless manner which has become the hallmark of the University.

After conducting examinations, we had been declaring results as quickly as possible and had even gone to the extent of declaring results within five working days of conducting examination. It is of great satisfaction to understand that early publication of results enables the students to appear for national level competitive examinations/ entrance examinations for admission to higher studies without losing a year. We are in the process of digitising evaluation which will enable us to declare results more quickly and efficiently.

The Research Division continued to undertake a number of programmes to create a research enabling environment and enhance research in the affiliated colleges.

We had been publishing official journal of the University – “Health Science” every year. During the year however, title registration has been done to start peer reviewed indexed

scientific journal with registration for research studies, for public circulation both in printed and soft copy versions.

The University has already established a School of Health policy and Planning with the intention of playing a leader ship and facilitatory role in health policy and planning, disease surveillance and monitoring, and the promotion of preventive, promotive and rehabilitatory aspects of health. Further, establishment of several centers and schools in different geographical areas of Kerala for promoting research in all systems of medicine and establishment of an academic staff college for training health professional teachers are in the initial stages of implementation. NSS activities of the University through 94 units in affiliated colleges has gathered momentum and intensified during the year.

The role of the University in improving the health sector of the State and carving a healthier society through its activities in health education is brought to the notice of the people of Kerala through this Annual Report.

Summary

- *The Kerala University of Health sciences was established under the Kerala University of Health Sciences Act 2010.*
- *The objectives of the University, as envisaged in the Act, are to ensure proper and systematic teaching, training and research in all systems of Medicines - Modern Medicine, Homeopathy and Indian systems of Medicine including Ayurveda, Siddha, Yoga & Naturopathy and Unani, Dentistry, Nursing and other areas of health care and health sciences in the state by providing the necessary implementation and oversight mechanisms.*
- *Ever since the Establishment of Kerala University of Health Sciences, it has been striving hard for achieving this basic objective – the timely conduct of Examinations and declaration of results so that students would not lose time during the period of a course. During the year under report 1012 examinations were conducted.*
- *The examinations conducted by the University has its own unique features such as choiceless question papers, electronic transmission of question papers to the theory examination centres, installation of digital surveillance system in examination halls etc.*
- *As far as evaluation system is concerned, the University has adopted the system of double valuation for all under graduate courses, followed by a third valuation whenever the marks scored by a student in the two valuations vary more than 15% of total marks.*
- *Important features of Examination system includes existence of a Committee called Malpractices and Lapses Enquiry Committee and Board of Adjudication for student grievances*
- *As a result of timely conduct of Exams and timely declaration of results of examinations, the erstwhile prevailing course lag could be avoided. All the more KUHS could establish a brand value for KUHS Degree /Diploma.*
- *As at the end of the year 296 institutions were affiliated to the University, including 16 institutions affiliated during the year.*
- *There were 20124 students during the year under Report*
- *The 6th and 7th convocations of the University were conducted on 20th April 2017, and 7th October 2017 respectively in which degrees/diplomas were awarded to a total of 13,892 students.*
- *During the year under Report, the University received a total income of Rs. 63.39 crore, which included Rs. 50.77 crore on account of fees and Rs. 12.42 crore on account of interest on fixed deposits. The total expenditure during the year was Rs. 48.81 crore and the excess of income over expenditure was Rs. 14.58 crore. As a result of continued excess of income over expenditure since inception, the Corpus fund of the University has grown up to Rs. 163.46 crore as at the end of the year.*

- *Besides involving itself in conducting sports and cultural activities of the Students Union, the Dean students affairs has actively monitored NSS activities through 94 units established in affiliated colleges.*
- *Besides monitoring research activities of PhD aspirants of the affiliated institutions, Dean Research has organised several workshops and training programmes including Research Methodology training programmes for the faculty and students*
- *Besides formulation and finalisation of Academic Regulations and Course Regulations, The Dean Academic has undertaken programmes under Schools and Centres, most of which are in the initial stages. In addition, the prestigious academic activity of KUHS oration was also conducted successfully. The Dean has also conducted several workshops, training programmes as also 'SAMAGRAM' Programme - A Unique Strategy for Comprehensive Development of KUHS*
- *The IT branch of the University supported the various information technology needs suitable for the various activities of the University, especially for conducting examinations.*
- *The Engineering Branch of the University has started several works, out of which 1st phase of one of the work (Construction of Building for School of Research in Ayurveda) was nearing completion as at the end of March 2018. Two other works, Construction of building for Utility Centre and construction of Mezanine floors were also nearing completion as at the end of the year. Future projects in the anvil included Construction of Building for School of Research in Ayurveda at Thrippunithura Phase-II, Construction of staff quarters, Construction of Auditorium and construction of Sewage Treatment Plant..*
- *During the year 409 complaints were received under the Right for Information Act, which were all complied within the time specified under the Act.*

INTRODUCTION

1. Introduction

The Kerala University of Health sciences, established under the Kerala University of Health Sciences Act 2010 strives to maintain high academic standards and quality of Health Sciences education. On completing almost nine years of its glorious existence, this institution can place on record the various achievements and contributions made by it in health education.

The University was established with the purpose of ensuring proper and systematic instruction, teaching, training and research in modern and Indian systems of medicine. Empowered to affiliate all health care professional Colleges throughout the State of Kerala, the University, as at the end of March 2018 has 296 colleges, belonging to all the disciplines and all the branches of health sciences affiliated to it.

2. Objectives

-  The objectives of the University, as envisaged in the Act, are to ensure proper and systematic teaching, training and research in all systems of Medicines (Modern Medicine, Homeopathy and Indian systems of Medicine including Ayurveda, Siddha, Yoga & Naturopathy and Unani, Dentistry, Nursing and other areas of health care and health sciences in the state by providing the necessary implementation and oversight mechanisms.
-  The University is expected to play a leadership and facilitatory role in health policy and planning, disease surveillance and monitoring, and the promotion of preventive, promotive and rehabilitative aspects of health.
-  The University is also mandated to address local and regional health issues, provide a platform for the dialogue as well as integrative research between different systems of health care and encourage the development of indigenous medicine and Homeopathy through research.
-  To design new courses and curricula based on the advances in the field of health sciences.
-  To regulate the standards of the affiliated colleges /institutions
-  To organize programs to track health problems of the society.
-  To give leadership to the medical human resource development in the state.
-  To give leadership to the health planning and health policy formulation for the state.
-  To give thrust to epidemiological studies, monitoring and surveillance system of the diseases prevalent in the State.
-  To develop a platform for the dialogue between different systems of health care.
-  To explore the possibilities of joint research programs and integration between different systems of medicine.
-  To promote equitable distribution of facilities for education in health and allied Sciences
-  To promote acquisition of Knowledge in a rapidly developing and changing society and to continuously offer opportunities for upgrading knowledge and imparting

training and development of skills in the context of innovations, research and discovery in all fields of human endeavor by establishing educational network related to health sciences with the use of modern communication media and technology appropriate for a learning society.

- ✚ To give more thrust for the development of Indian systems of Medicine and all its branches and Homoeopathy by encouraging research and other academic activities in the relative areas.

ACADEMIC BRANCH

ACTIVITIES OF ACADEMIC BRANCH

The main activities of academic branch during the year have been summarised as under:

i) STUDENT REGISTRATION

It is one of the major activities of this branch. The University fixes a cut-off date for uploading of basic data of the students who have got admission in affiliated institutions under KUHS by concerned colleges/institutions/ based on the allotment memo issued by the Entrance Commissioner. This is consolidated in the Academic section and is forwarded to the concerned Councils and to the Admission Supervisory Committee. Then a date for document verification is fixed for all colleges/institutions.

At the time of verification, the institutions have to produce the following documents:

1. Original Qualifying certificates/Transfer Certificate of admitted students.
2. Consolidated report of the concerned course.
3. Student proforma of the candidates
4. Government Agreement.
5. Prospectus of the concerned college
6. Certificate to provide evaluators by the Principals of concerned colleges.
7. Student Admission Register.
8. Allotment memo of students to the concerned college issued by the Entrance Commissioner.

The consolidated report of students produced at the time of verification by colleges/institutions should tally with the details already available with the University. The deficiency if any found on verification is intimated to them through a verification report. Only after clearing these deficiencies, Registration Number, ID card etc are allotted to students.

ii) CONVENING OF MEETINGS AND WORKSHOPS

The branch greatly contributes in convening the meetings of the General Council, Academic Council, Various Faculty meetings, Board of Studies meetings, conducting workshops to the inspection teams for granting affiliation to new colleges, courses and for continuation of affiliation etc.

iii) Matters related to issuance of Equivalency certificate, Condonation of break of study etc. are also being dealt by the branch.

iv) This branch also plays a major role in conducting convocation ceremony of passed out students.

v) AFFILIATION

Granting affiliation to the intending colleges/institutions and courses is also one of the major activity of the branch. The norms for granting of provisional affiliation and continuation of provisional affiliation to colleges and courses are as detailed below:

A committee empowered to appoint the inspection committee will be appointed by the Vice

chancellor. The inspection committee will only fill the format and shall not give any recommendation regarding the eligibility for recognition. The Board of studies will be entrusted with the responsibility of finalizing the requirements for each course and the format of inspection. They should conform to the requirements of statutory council wherever available. Dean of faculty will be responsible for finalizing and submitting the format for the concerned specialities. The minimum requirements should not be shown in the format given to the inspectors. The minimum requirements will be given to the scrutiny committee, while scrutinizing the inspection report. If there is a need, re-inspection should be entrusted to the same committee which did the inspection.

vi) THE SCRUTINY OF INSPECTION REPORTS

The reports should be scrutinized by a 3 member committee constituted by The Vice chancellor which include Dean of the speciality and 2 Principals (of which one should be from Government sector). It should be assured that the members of the committee should not be from the same college or working under the same management. The scrutiny committee should check whether the colleges satisfies the requirements for affiliation and may make 3 decisions

1. Recommend affiliation with no of seats
2. In case of major deficiency recommend rejection of applications for affiliation
3. In case of minor deficiencies the committee may refer the details of deficiencies and the Academic Branch will inform the colleges to rectify the deficiencies. On receipt of the compliance report from Principal, re inspection with the same inspection team will be posted if necessary.

Depending on the report from a scrutiny committee, the Vice chancellor may sanction consent for affiliation which can be submitted to Governing Council.

In case of provisional affiliation, the affiliation subcommittee of Governing Council (constituted by 3 DMEs) shall evaluate the documents and submit the report to the GC and GC will arrive at a decision.

In the case of granting of Continuation of Affiliation also the process is the same. Vice Chancellor will grant sanction, and later report to Governing Council.

vii) COMPLAINT REDRESSAL

In case of any complaints regarding the affiliation, the redressal should be in conformity with clause 55 of the Act. Vice chancellor shall constitute a 3 member committee which include dean of the faculty, and one expert from outside the university and one from the university to look into the complaint and submit a report if necessary with re inspection. Re inspection by the same inspectors is mandatory before accepting the conditional affiliation.

viii) A list of Colleges affiliated with the University, courses for which affiliation is given student intake etc as at the end of the year is appended as an Annexure at the end of the Report.

ix) A hand book of institutions affiliated to the University – KUHS – Towards Frontiers of Excellence – containing information in respect of colleges available and courses conducted and other data regarding the colleges, provided and authenticated by the institutions has been separately brought out by the University in the year 2018. However, based on the same, colleges having academic excellence are highlighted in the ensuing pages:

STATUTORY AND ACADEMIC BODIES

1. Senate

The Senate is the statutory authority constituted to formulate the broad policies and programmes of the University and to suggest measures for improvement and development of the University. The Senate shall consist of ex-officio members, nominated members and elected members. The ex-officio members includes

- The Chancellor
- The Pro-Chancellor
- The Vice Chancellor
- The pro-Vice Chancellor
- The Secretary to Government, Health Department in-charge of Medical Education.
- The Secretary to Government, Finance Department
- The Director of Medical Education
- The Director of Health Services.
- The Directors of various systems of Medicine
- A member of the Kerala State Higher Education Council
- The Chairman of the University Students Union
- The Registrar and
- All Deans of the Faculties of the University.

The Nominated members consists of heads of University Departments or schools, Principals of Government colleges of various systems of Medicine and persons having interest in health sciences nominated by Government.

The elected members consists of Medical practitioners of various systems of medicine, principals of private colleges of various systems of medicine, members elected from Legislative Assembly of Kerala, members elected from the teachers of Government/Private colleges of various systems of Medicine, members of Managers of Private Medical and allied colleges, members elected form Non-teaching staff of affiliated colleges/University etc.

The names and addresses of the Senate members are enlisted in the beginning of the Report.

2. GOVERNING COUNCIL

The Governing Council is the supreme administrative body of the University. The important powers of the Governing Council *inter alia* envisages that

- Make statutes and ordinances necessary for the working of the University.
- Hold, control and administer the properties and funds of the University.
- Consider and pass the financial estimates and budget of the University.
- Affiliates medical institutions in accordance with the terms and conditions of such affiliation provided by the Act and Statute
- Approve the appointment of the faculty members and members of the board of studies etc.

- Fix and regulate fee payable by the students in colleges affiliated to the University.
- Approve appointment of teachers in private and aided colleges.
- Hold, control and arrange for administration of assets and properties of the University.
- Acquire movable or immovable property for the University.
- Provide buildings, premises, furniture, apparatus, equipments, instruments and other means needed for the conduct of the University.
- Institutes and confer degrees, diplomas, certificates and other academic distinctions as recommended by the Academic Council and arrange for convocation for conferment of the same as provided by the Statute and ordinances.
- Create regular post of officers and other employees of the University with the prior approval of the State Government.
- Consider and approve annual report, annual accounts and audit report of the University.

2. ACADEMIC COUNCIL

The Academic Council is responsible for laying down the academic policies in regard to maintenance and improvement of standards of teaching, research and collaboration programmes. The names and addresses of the members of Academic Council during the year under Report are stated in the beginning of this Report

3. BOARD OF EXAMINATIONS

The Board of examinations is the authority for conducting examinations and making policy decisions in regard to organizing and conducting examinations, improving the system of examinations, appointing paper setters and examiners, preparation of the schedule of examinations and declaration of results. The names and addresses of the members of the Board during the year under Report are stated in the beginning of this Report

4. BOARD OF STUDIES

The Board of Studies, empowered to recommend the courses of studies, improvement in the course of studies and to decide upon the requirement for each course of study, has been set up separately for the different branches of medicine. 5. FACULTIES

The faculties are the principal academic co-ordination authorities of the University in respect of studies and research on the subjects included in the faculty and also in respect of studies and research on multi-disciplinary faculties. 6. FINANCE COMMITTEE

The Finance Committee expected to give advice to the University authorities on matters related to the finances of the University has the following powers:

- To consider and make recommendations to the Governing Council on the proposals for new expenditure on major works and purchases
- To scrutinise re-appropriation statements and audit notes and make recommendations to the Governing Council
- To review the finances of the University and to suggest concurrent audit conducted wherever necessary.
- To give advice and make recommendations to the Governing Council on any other financial question affecting the affairs of the University

FINANCE BRANCH

Finance Branch

The matters connected with Finance, Accounts and Audit of the University are dealt with, by the Finance Branch. During the year under Report, the Branch was having two sub branches:- viz: General Finance and Examination Finance.

Finance officer is the controlling officer of the Branch and the principal advisor on all matters connected with Finance, Accounts and Audit of the University. He was assisted by one Deputy Registrar and one Assistant Registrar, for the smooth functioning of General Finance Sub Branch and Examination Finance Sub Branch respectively.

The General Finance Sub Branch deals with collection and accounting of affiliation fees, continuation of affiliation fees, annual administration fees, student registration fees, refundable deposits from the colleges affiliated to the University and such other receipts. It constantly interacts with Government and other agencies for allotment of grants, accounts grants received and submits utilisation certificates for the same. Preparation of Annual Budget for the various receipts and payments anticipated during the ensuing year on a realistic basis, also keeping in view the fund requirements for the infrastructural and developmental activities of the University is an important function of the section. Preparation of Annual Accounts, payment of work bills, purchase bills, salary bills and other establishment and administrative bills, filing of statutory returns, attending to internal audit, Local fund audit (State) and CAG audit are also the responsibility of the section.

The Exam Finance Sub Branch deals with all payments relating to conduct of examinations namely payment of advances for theory and practical examinations, centralised valuation camps, TA and sitting fee to members of pass boards, examination committees, subject experts, external examiners, practical convenors, question paper setters, dissertation evaluators, remuneration to nodal officers etc. The Exam Finance Sub Branch has been very keen in timely processing of the claims and disbursing them through RTGS mode despite large quantum of work load which is increasing day by day.

The Act and Statutes of the University envisage that all grants and loans received from the State Government, the Government of India, the University Grants Commission and from any other source, all revenues of the University, all fees received, all income such as rent and profits derived from properties and funds vested in the University, all endowments and donations received from any source whatsoever, all other miscellaneous receipts of the University and deposits, remittances and service of funds, received in connection with the affairs of the University shall form one consolidated fund styled "Kerala University of Health Sciences Fund" and shall be utilized for the purposes and in the manner laid down in the Act and in the Statutes, Ordinances, Regulations, Bye-Laws and Orders. In order to control the inflow and out flow of funds, the University resorts to Budgetary control system. The Annual Budget for the year 2017-18 in a nutshell was as under

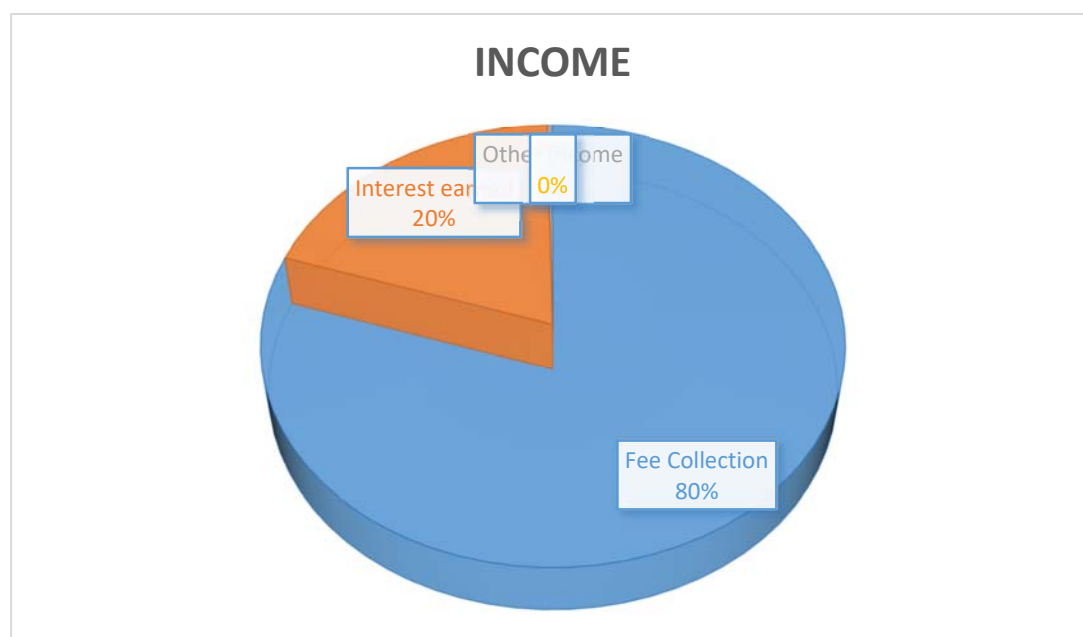

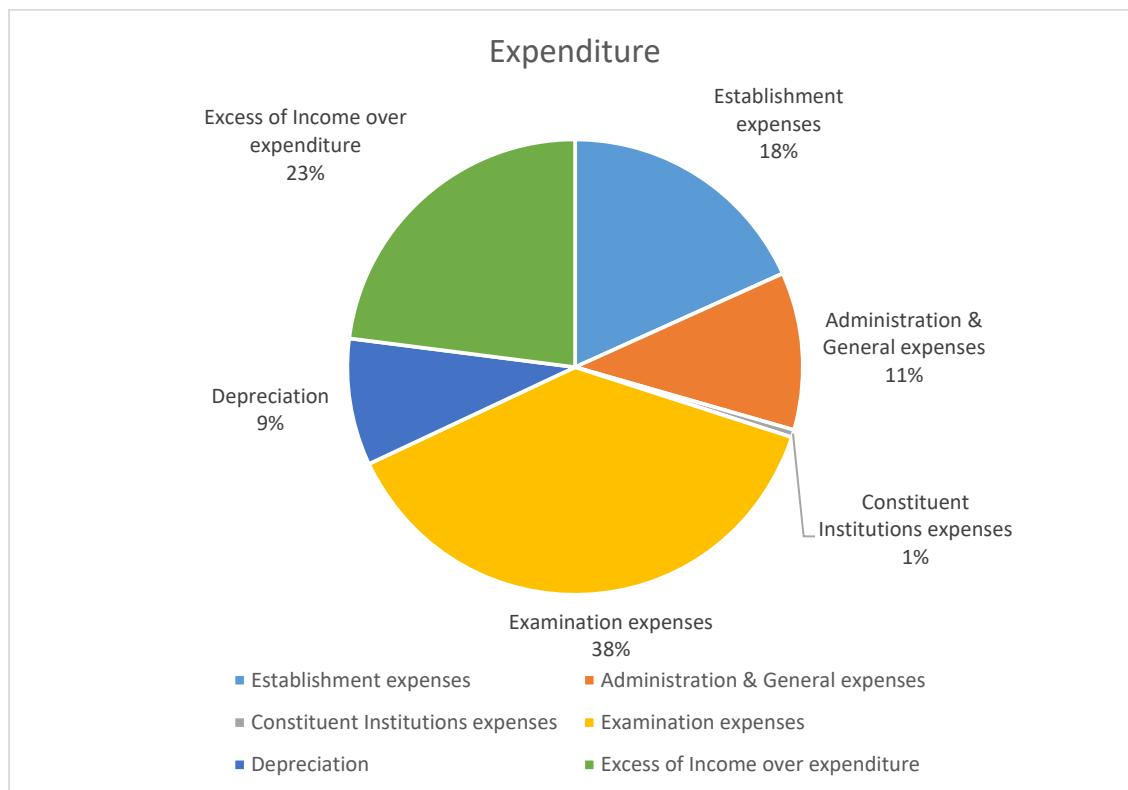
The accounting is based on accrual principle under double entry system, broadly complying with the Accounting Standards issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India. The Accounts were computerised with the help of a software developed through the agency of National Informatics Centre, New Delhi. The procedure adopted includes preparation of receipt and payment vouchers at individual seats, checking of the vouchers at Section officer/Assistant Registrar level and Approval of the vouchers by Finance Officer. Once the vouchers are approved, the software posts the same to appropriate ledger accounts, prepare a trial balance, Income and Expenditure account and Balance sheet for a specified period. Adjustment entries, if any, are passed manually.

Activities of Dean Students Affairs

Dean: Dr. A.K Manoj Kumar, Dean, Student Affairs.

1.Duties Assigned

The Dean Students Affairs appointed by the Governing Council through a selection Committee constituted by the Council, has been assigned the following duties:

1. Giving suggestions regarding the student welfare to the Vice Chancellor,
2. Organizing and facilitating non-academic and co-curricular programs related to welfare of the students of the university and affiliated colleges,
3. Establishing the Regulations regarding University Arts and Sports festivals and other similar activities,
4. Organizing university level elections for bodies like student council,
5. Implementing the decisions of the governing council and advising Vice Chancellor regarding the functions of student council, etc.
6. Advising the Vice Chancellor regarding the co-curricular activities in the University and affiliated colleges,
7. Organizing consultation and meeting with experts in the field of arts, sports, social welfare activities etc. involving students.
8. Coordinating activities of organizations like NSS, Blood and organ donors' forum, NCC and other similar organizations and groups at University level and overseeing and coordinating their activities at various levels as envisaged in S 6(xlii) of the Act.
9. Organizing student welfare activities in consultation with other academic bodies like faculties, board of studies, etc. and
10. any other responsibility entrusted by Vice chancellor
11. He shall be the Convener of Board for Adjudication on students' grievances.
12. He shall recommend names for award of scholarship based on decisions of the Governing council for excellence in arts, sports, etc.
13. He shall ensure that students to represent their classes, colleges or the University as the case may be, for sports, cultural and all other activities, selected entirely on the basis of merit
14. He shall coordinate student guidance regarding employment and career progress, psycho social guidance at various levels, etc.

2. Activities during the year

During the year 2017-18, the activities of Dean Student affairs were as under:

i) Student Support and Guidance Programme (SSGP)

Under the Student Support and Guidance Programme of KUHS, 6 region wise training Workshops were conducted for the Nodal Officers of SSGP at Trivandrum (17/ 11/ 2017), Pathanamthitta (08/ 12/ 2017), Ernakulam (24/ 11/ 2017), Thrissur (16/ 11/ 2017), Kozhikode

(18/ 12/ 2017) and Kannur (19/ 12/ 2017) Districts. The Vice Chancellor of the University has inaugurated the meetings. The Teachers were trained in the topics of basic principles of counselling, practical skills counselling in the above domains. This helped them to support and guide the students and also to help other faculty in the college in handling issues related to these topics. The selected teachers will be given continued support by the core team in KUHS.

ii) Fitness Programme

Objectives of the Programme

Constituted a fitness committee in each colleges for first year students to develop & Maintain Physical Fitness and Prevent Non Communicable Diseases (NCDs) by doing Warm ups/Aerobics/Yoga/Relaxation in 3 days /week and to assess BP, BMI, Weight (Birth, 1yr, Current).

41 Colleges have implemented Fitness Programme and submitted their report during the year.

iii) Meeting of Students Council

The Budget of University Students Union was approved in the Student's council meeting held on 04/04/2017. Revised Budget of University Students Union was approved in the Student's council meeting held on 28/10/2017.

iv) University Students Union Election

Election of 10 members to General Council of KUHS Students from private, self financing, unaided colleges was held on 19/03/2018. Necessary arrangements were done for the conduct of election to KUHS Students Union Executive Council.

v) Anti ragging Complaints

6. Details of NSS Units

The University NSS Cell with the co-operation of all the NSS units under the University had carried out various NSS activities during the year 2017-18. With the allotment of one additional funded Unit and 12 self-financing Units, there are 64 NSS Funded Units and 30 Self Finance Units under the University NSS cell. The University has received an amount of Rs.22, 54,000/- as grant in aid during the year 2017-18 towards NSS activities.

Details of various NSS activities of the University NSS Cell.

(1). Basic self support training programmes:-

The University has decided to implement the Basic Life Support programme, a Flag Ship programme of the University NSS Cell, with a tentative budget of Rs.10,00,000/-. The State level inauguration of the programme was held on 31.10.2018 at Vimala College, Thrissur and Dr. (Prof) M.K.C. Nair Vice Chancellor of the University has inaugurated the function.

Action was also initiated to implement the BLS training programme in Thrissur District, as a pilot project and Dr. Sajna M.V. Programme Officer, Govt. Medical College was nominated as the programme coordinator for BLS for Thrissur District. The training on BLS in the colleges is being conducted in phased manner in the District.

(ii). Prevention of Life style disorders

The Second Flag Ship Programme of the University NSS Cell was creating mass awareness on the prevention of Life Style Disorders occurred in our society by changing the food habits. It aims at making the public, especially youths about the bad effects and various health problems such as obesity, blood pressure, sugar, cancer etc associated with the consumption of junk foods and other soft drinks. A workshop on the Life Style Disorders and Drug abuse was conducted at the Seminar Hall on 01.06.2018 to the NSS Programme Officers.

iii) Registration in PFMS

Registration of all funded Units with the Public Financial Management System portal was completed.

Iv) Self Finance Unit

ACTIVITIES OF DEAN (ACADEMIC)

Dean : Dr. V.V. Unnikrishnan

1. DUTIES ASSIGNED

- Giving suggestions regarding academic improvement of the university to the University Quality Assurance Council, Academic Council and the Vice Chancellor,
 - Organizing and facilitating the various activities related to academic development in the university and affiliated Colleges.
 - Supporting the activities of the various academic bodies like faculties, Academic Council, Board of Studies etc. with the cooperation and support from the concerned sections of the University.
 - Coordinating the design and vetting of the academic regulations, syllabus of various courses affiliated by the University.
 - Advising the Board of Studies/Academic Council/Vice Chancellor regarding the initiation of new courses, modifications in the existing courses and forming the curriculum in the University.
 - Supervising the implementation of the decisions of Academic Council.
 - Advice and support the administration regarding enhancement of academic standards in the university and in the institutions there under, and in endeavouring for the achievement of high academic standards,
 - Organizing programs for the academic improvement of the faculties of the university and in the affiliated colleges,
 - To initiate action for preparation of the Academic Calendar for each year for various faculties in consultation with the deans of faculties and submit the same before the Academic Council and the Governing Council through the Registrar,
10. Co-ordinating academic activities of the University, and carry out such other responsibilities as may be entrusted to him by the Vice chancellor.

2. Activities of Dean (Academic)

i) Formulation and finalisation of Academic Regulations and Course Regulations.

Section 44 of KUHS Act lays down that the Academic Council of the University may make regulations in the manner prescribed by statutes providing for all or all any of the following matters namely –

- (i) the courses of studies and the conduct of examinations;
- (ii) the admission of students to the various courses of study and to the examinations;
- (iii) the qualification of teachers;
- (iv) the appointment and prescription of duties of the Boards of studies and examiners;
- (v) recognition of examinations, degrees and diplomas of the Universities as equivalent to the examinations, degrees and diplomas of the University; and
- (vi) all other matters which under the provisions of the Act, statute and ordinances are to be, or may be, prescribed by the regulations.

Accordingly, the University completed the formulation of Academic Regulations 2016 (applicable for 2016-17 admission onwards) after several levels of vetting by Academic Council, Governing Council and Senate as also after Legal Vetting. The Regulations were consequently Gazetted in January 2018

ii) CENTRE FOR INTER-DISCIPLINARY ALLIED HEALTH SCIENCES AND TECHNOLOGY STUDIES

The broad objective of this centre is to promote interdisciplinary research within the health sector, allied science and with specific focus on technology collaboration with all branches of science and technology relevant to health of people. In addition, (i) to consolidate all allied health sciences, including technology that are relevant to progress in medicine (ii) to give further impetus to research in the traditional allied sciences like medical psychology, medical sociology, philosophy of medicine, biostatistics, epidemiology, physiotherapy, speech and hearing, etc. that may help in health care. (iii) to identify further research collaboration areas in biotechnology, medical radiation technology, biomedical engineering, genomic science, nanotechnology etc. that may help in health science or health care system, and (iv) to add new areas and subjects as we progress in health sciences and technology. The activities of the centre includes research, documentation and training. In research, to find out “perceived skill development assessment of final year students”. KUHS to understand the perceived skills of final year under graduate allied health students affiliated to KUHS in the 13 districts of Kerala state, using census method with specifically developed seven tools and checklists for seven undergraduate allied health courses. The project is now in data collection phase; the collected data has been entering into system through data entry format which will be statistically analysed in the next level. In addition, there are two articles accepted for publication; one review article, one article and three chapters for health care counselling book are in a draft level.

iii) Centre for disability Management studies

Disability is an umbrella term, covering impairments, activity limitations and participation restrictions. Impairment is a problem in body function or structure; an activity limitation is a difficulty encountered by an individual in executing a task or action; while participation restriction is a problem experienced by an individual in involvement in life situations. Presently disabilities have many unmet health and rehabilitation needs and face barriers in accessing mainstream health-care services. Mild and moderate degrees of physical and mental disability are unrecognized by the health care delivery system. The main of the centre is to envisage research contribution for improving quality of life and needs of the people with disability and to act as repository centre regarding the disabilities. This includes gathering information regarding various programmes, policies and schemes available at national and state level for the disabled persons of existing rehabilitation centre available in Kerala. The Centre for Disability Management Studies observed the day 3rd Dec 2016 on International day for disability person focussed with a theme “Healthy Living with Disability” and CME(Continuing Medical Education) on Neuro Developmental Disability / Disorders / Child Development on 30th November 2017.

iv) Centre for Medical Simulation

Simulation-based medical education is a rapidly growing field, as is illustrated by the increased development of simulation centres worldwide. It is becoming a powerful force in addressing the need to increase patient safety through quality-care training. The main goal of setting up a Centre for Medical Simulation is to improve safety within patient care. Current and future health care professionals “practice on plastic” fine tuning their skills, refining advanced techniques and learning valuable social interactive tools for delivering important news to patients. This translational research becomes vital for creating the gold-standard in patient safety and medical teaching. The idea of Centre for Medical Simulation (CMS) is to provide world-class healthcare simulation for a broad spectrum of providers and applications. Hands-on simulation helps teams and individuals develop preparedness and insight that is best learned and practiced in realistic conditions.

Objectives

The broad objective of the Centre is to develop a world-class immersive, simulation-based learning environment where medical education is enhanced through simulation technology, innovation and research.

- i) To establish a functional simulation lab as a model for affiliated colleges supporting under graduate training in various medical streams using simulators and manikins
- ii) To establish a skill lab to train under graduates, post graduates and teachers in various procedures and techniques
- iii) To reduce avoidable trauma in the present practice of using patients as objects of training from the beginning.

During the year under report a workshop on medical simulation was conducted.

v). Academic Staff College

It was generally recognized that the present system of higher education does not provide opportunities for the professional development of teachers. The key concept underlined is to strengthen the crucial link between teacher motivation and quality of education and improve quality of teaching by providing ample opportunities for professional and career oriented development. The Academic Staff College has been launched to enhance the skills of KUHS staff at various levels. Various programs are being designed for faculty members to help them get updated on the latest trends in academics and health system. The orientation and refresher programs are aimed at helping the faculty members at different levels augment their knowledge base and to improve their teaching skills.

3. KUHS Oration

KUHS Oration is the most prestigious academic activity of the University. The University could bring the most eligible scientific minds in the country to give oration on important health related scientific topics. During 2015-16, Dr. Arun Jamkar, Hon'ble Vice Chancellor of Maharashtra University of Health Sciences had given oration on the topic Mirror Neurons. During the year 2016-17, Dr. N.K.Arora, Executive Director, The Inclean Trust International, New Delhi had given oration on Determinants of Childhood Obesity in India and during the year under Report Oration was given by Prof. Dr. Paul Russel, Professor and Head of Psychiatry, CMC Vellore on the topic "Post Traumatic Stress Disorders in the Post Flood Scenario in Kerala"

The following points were highlighted during the oration:

- Post - traumatic Stress Disorder [PTSD] is a disorder that develops in response to a stressful event or situation of exceptionally threatening/catastrophic nature such as assault, road accident, disaster, rape and natural disaster.
- The Asian earthquake and subsequent tsunami of December 2004, one of the largest natural disasters in recent history, resulted in the deaths of over 250,000 people with the prevalence of 70.7% for acute PTSD and 10.9% for delayed onset PTSD.
- Prevalence was more among girls with those exposed in particular to loss of family members and property.
- PTSD is widely prevalent among the survivors of the tsunami, reinforcing the need to develop an effective, culturally sensitive outreach therapy strategy for them.
- Indirect exposure through watching the disaster in television, internet etc. can also contribute to develop the post-disaster mental health problem.
- PTSD symptoms are severe in a manner preventing the victim, to go back to daily life.
- All PTSD sufferers should be offered a course of trauma-focused psychological treatment (trauma-focused cognitive behavioural therapy).
- For individuals at high risk of developing PTSD following a major disaster, consideration should be given (by those responsible for coordination of the disaster plan) to the routine use of a brief screening instrument for PTSD at 1 month after the disaster.
- Professor Russel highlighted the need for sustained surveillance among the affected population.

About 300 participants consisting of faculty members of various streams, under-graduate and Postgraduate students of the Government Medical College, Thrissur and Research Scholars from various sectors attended the oration. The program was highly appreciated for its relevance, content and exceptional delivery.

'SAMAGRAM' Programme: A Unique Strategy for Comprehensive Development of KUHS

1.1. Introduction

'SAMAGRAM' Program is a Comprehensive Program for Integrated Academic Development of KUHS

1.2. Brief description:

The University has several programs which need an integrated and comprehensive implementation strategy. This includes Academic Monitoring Cell, Accreditation of Teachers and Institutions, Student Support & Guidance Program, Research Enabling initiatives, Digital Evaluation etc. However, it requires a professional scientific approach, expertise, human resource, equipment and documentation. The present system may not be able to undertake this task in its entirety.

The Samagram program is envisaged to incorporate all the Academic, Research and Student Support initiatives of KUHS, which were hitherto implemented through the offices of the three respective University Deans under a single umbrella and implemented in a time bound, monitored manner and evaluated periodically.

1.3. Provisions under the KUHS Act and Statutes

The KUHS Act 2010 empowers the University to undertake this program as envisaged under Chapter II (5) i, ii, vi, viii, xi, xiii [Objects of the University], and Chapter II (6) ii, iv, vi, ix, xiv, xvi, xvii, xx, xxi, xxii, xxiv [Powers & Functions of the University]

As per the provisions under the Chapter II[A] iii, xiii and [B] ii, iii of the First Statutes, the Vice Chancellor is empowered to implement this program.

This is a Comprehensive, Co-ordinated, Monitored, Measurable implementation of existing University Programs in a prioritized manner. It also functions as a potential system for Internal

Academic Monitoring and Process Audit. This mode is essential for the time-bound accomplishment of the objectives.

The project has since been approved by the Planning Committee on 18-12-2018. Existing auditing procedures shall apply.

University Act Chapter II Section 5 contemplates that the university may establish study centers at such other places within the state of Kerala. The Governing Council of the University in March 2011, had decided to establish schools on specific areas of studies.

- School of Fundamental Research in Ayurveda , Thrippunithura- professor in charge:- Dr. Sudhikumar.K.B
- School of Family Health Studies, Kozhikode - professor in charge:-Dr.Rajamohanan.K

1. KUHS-School of Health Policy and Planning, Thiruvananthapuram

University Act Chapter II Section 5 contemplates that the university may establish study centers at such other places within the state of Kerala. The Governing Council of the University at the third meeting held on 18-3-2011 decided to establish schools on specific areas of studies. One of the schools is Health policy and planning at Thiruvananthapuram.

The school of health policy and planning started functioning in 2016, housed in a rented building at Trivandrum.

The mandate is to facilitate sound health care practices and policies by enabling all stakeholders in health care delivery to make informed decisions by synthesizing and interpreting available evidence and by carrying out new research efforts to fill in gaps in existing knowledge. The center will be engaged in data collection, compilation and analysis and institute appropriate research and surveys for the purpose in order to develop evidence based and feasible plans

Major Activities done:

1. Research methodology facilitation.

It is mentioned in the state health policy that there should be efforts to develop research enabling environment in the state. The school is helping the KUHS in all its efforts on research capacity building in the state. School is conducting regular research methodology training programs, consultations and certificate courses for faculty as well as the postgraduates.

2. Perspective Plan for KUHS:

Section 51 of Kerala University of Health Act 2010 states that "The University shall prepare a perspective plan for educational development for five years and shall be updated every five years". The university constituted a committee for this with Mr. Justice M.R. Hariharan Nair (Retd.) Former Judge of the H.C. of Kerala as chairman. The report was submitted in time and the Governing council accepted it. The school has provided all the technical support for this activity.

3. Intramural research projects

The school is now involved in the project “Changing Family Environment and its Effects on Physical, Mental and Social health of individuals in Kerala - a KUHS study “with the Aim to study the changes that occurred in contemporary families and its effects on the physical, mental and social health of family members in Kerala

4. Health policy studies:

The school has taken steps to do health policy methodology studies and an interest group has been formed. Two workshops were conducted and the proceedings of this academic work was published as a special issue in the official journal of KUHS. Health Science.

5. Response to emergency situations

The school has taken initiative to document the experience of affiliated medical institutions in the flood relief activity. An experience sharing workshop was conducted and the document was released by the Hon. Chancellor of the university.

In anticipation of an epidemic following flood, guidelines for prevention of Leptospirosis was developed and published in the KUHS site for the use of health science professionals and people of Kerala.

A comprehensive technical update on management and control of Leptospirosis in the context of Kerala is prepared.

6. Academic interventions in key policy areas

The school has identified mortality reduction in Kerala as a policy area and started workshops on mortality reduction experience of the state. The Govt. of Kerala has already started programs in partnership with KFOG and IAP for maternal mortality and infant mortality reduction. The school has started joining this initiative and developed support tools for breast feeding promotion and infant death review.

7. Epidemiology teaching and training and knowledge updating of trained epidemiologists.
The school has started several knowledge updating sessions for PhD scholars and MPhil Epidemiology holders.

Activities planned and continuing

The areas now actively involved are

- Health policy studies: comparative studies of health policy documents, teaching learning of, health policy methodology like Health policy analysis
- Continuing the primary research work and existing project, Family health studies
- Continuing the already started work on key policy areas in the state: Mortality reduction and healthy start for breast feeding promotion
- Continue research methodology promotion and capacity building: The certificate courses and training programs
- Validation of the score card for initial screening of applications for new course or college under the university done as a part of the perspective plan.
- To continue the MPhil Clinical epidemiology directly under the university.

2. School of Research in Ayurveda (AYUSH) – Thripunithura

Ayurveda is known for its inherent strength and potential to provide holistic health care and help people to lead healthy lives. However, its potential has not been tapped to meet the health needs of the country and bridge the gaps that the conventional medical system carries. In order to get better prepared and equipped to face the emerging challenges and international developments in the area of health care, the extent and quality of research has to be augmented to widen the evidence base and generate new knowledge. Development of evidence based clinical approaches is crucial for Ayurveda to establish the utility of traditional and time tested knowledge imbibed in classical texts. It is also important that the knowledge generated with scientific efforts is properly disseminated for awareness building of masses in general and other stakeholders in particular. A meaningful interface between the research institutions, academia and industry is therefore required to translate research outcomes for public use and bridge the knowledge gaps. One of the objectives of the University is to give more thrust for the development of Indian systems of medicine and all its branches by encouraging research and other academic activities in the related areas. It is in this context that the School of Research in Ayurveda is proposed in Tripunithura.

Objectives

1. To conduct high quality state of art research in conformity with international standards
2. To disseminate the knowledge
3. To serve as a national centre for doctoral and post-doctoral studies

Research areas

The entire research activities coming under the purview of the school can be divided into four:

- Centre for literary and pedagogical research
- Centre for medicinal plant research
- Centre for pharmaceutical research
- Centre for clinical research

During the year Construction of the Building for the Centre was in progress and phase I has already been completed and construction of phase II will be taken up shortly.

The school started functioning on its own building w.e.f. October 2017. The following projects are in the anvil:

1. To develop a Structured data base of Post graduate dissertation

- 2 Skill development programmes
- 3 To start conceptual studies
- 4 Coordination of earlier KUHS approved multicentre clinical trials

I. Structured Data base of PG dissertation

Structured data base will give a definite picture by categorising the dissertations of different subjects. Many researches have been carried out in basic principles department, Dravyaguna, Rasasastra, BhaishajyaKalpana, Kriyasareera, roganidana, swasthavritha, agadatantra, Manasikaroga, Kayachikitsa, Panchakarma, Salyatantra, salakyatantra, Prasoothitantra departments. Further we may know that how many conceptual studies, pharmacological studies, pharmaceutical and clinical trials, the areas of clinical trials have been already under went.

Started the work in October 2017 by collecting the data from Government Ayurveda College Tripunithura. There were 56 dissertations at Ayurveda college Tripunithura from 2006 to 2009 and personally collected the data and converted it into structured formant and the data entry is continuing. From 2010 onwards the synopsis and dissertation soft copy will be available at KUHS IT section. The earlier dissertations data has to be collected from Govt AVC, Thiruvananthapuram, Kannur, VPSV Kottakkal, MVR Parasinikadavu Kannur. The amount of volume roughly 700 dissertations from TVM, 20 from AVC Kannur, 16 from MVR college, 30 from VPSV Kottakkal. This is a huge task and the Project officer alone can't do it.

Training programmes conducted

The Department of Swasthavritta in association with SFRA and Kerala University of Health Sciences has conducted a 5 day Yoga training programme for Ayurveda faculties at Govt. Ayurveda College Hospital, Tripunithura. Around 20 delegates from various Ayurveda colleges under KUHS, officials and staff of Government Ayurveda College Tripunithura have participated in the programme. The programme covered 15 hours of theory classes along with 9 hours of practical.

3. School of Family Health Studies - Kozhikode

WHO defines health as--The family is the smallest social unit enabling survival, growth, development and achieve the optimal potential of every member of the family from children to grandparents across the whole lifecycle. However, there are huge impediments for this in many areas - physical, mental, psychological, educational, social, economic, religious and spiritual dimensions. These issue has not been adequately addressed in a comprehensive manner especially the huge regional variations. The School of Family Health Studies to be set up at Kozhikode in Malabar region, often considered as a relatively backward area of Kerala.

The National Family Health Surveys (NFHS) have been addressing some of these issues in totality. The latest NFHS – 4 to be implemented in 2014-15 has two specific objectives: i) to provide essential data on health and family welfare needed by the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare and other agencies for policy and programme purposes, and ii) to provide information on important emerging health and family welfare issues.

Therefore, NFHS -4, will:

1. Provide estimates of the levels of fertility, infant and child mortality, and other family welfare and health indicators by background characteristics at the national and state levels; and
2. Measure trends in family welfare and health indicators over time at the national and state levels.

3. Provide information on several other emerging issues including: -
 - a. Perinatal mortality,
 - b. adolescent reproductive health,
 - c. high-risk sexual behaviour,
 - d. safe injections,
 - e. tuberculosis, and malaria;
 - f. Family welfare and health conditions among slum dwellers;
 - g. Non-communicable diseases;
 - h. Use of emergency contraception; and
 - i. HIV prevalence for adult women and men

Recent studies report that chronic diseases have displaced communicable diseases as the leading cause of death and disability in India.⁸ Identification of risk factors through screening is an important tool in the fight against chronic diseases. Among the Indian states, Kerala is at the most advanced stage of an epidemiologic transition that has brought about a dramatic change in the disease profile. Now lifestyle diseases are the major cause of death in Kerala. The burden of deaths from cardiovascular diseases now exceeds that of industrialized countries.¹⁰ However, necessary reorientation of a public health strategy that focuses on chronic diseases has not yet taken place. This has resulted in high prevalence of many chronic diseases and risk factors in Kerala which necessitates development and implementation of preventive strategies, early detection and early intervention for lifestyle diseases.

Divorce rate is increasing tremendously in Kerala. Domestic violence is a global issue, reaching across national boundaries as well as socio-economic, cultural and class distributions. It is a widespread, deeply ingrained evil, which has serious impact on woman's health and well-being. Domestic violence can be described as the power, misused by one adult in a relationship, to control another. It is perpetrated by and on both men and women. However, most commonly the victims are women and the perpetrators are their husbands.¹ Domestic violence not only causes physical injury, it also undermines the social, economic and psychological well-being of the victim, the perpetrator and the society as a whole. It has serious consequences on women's mental and physical health, including their reproductive and sexual health. These include injuries, gynaecological problems, temporary or permanent disabilities, depression and suicide amongst others.

Every family is different. But many families face similar issues. Relationship problems can arise at various stages of our lives. Keeping relationships on track is not always easy. Having a shaky moment does not mean the relationship is in trouble but it may be a sign that

one could do with some help. Family counselling can guide and support couples to meet the challenges of life. Family counselling can help maintain valued family relationships even after separation. At this time, parents need to focus on what is best for their children. Children will have feelings and emotions that they may not be able to understand or deal with.

Human relationship education during the school years that provides skills in communication, problem solving and conflict resolution, and which encourages self-esteem, may also prepare young people for mature relationships as partners, parents and community members. Since relationships are dynamic and family circumstances alter over the life course (birth of a child, dealing with teenagers, a change in employment, illness of a family member), couples may benefit more from ongoing opportunities for a range of education and counselling options across the different stages of marriage and family life along with premarital education sessions. A range of programs and services can be made available to develop understanding and skills in interpersonal relationship and parenting competence. By setting up a school for addressing family health counselling in all its dimensions will benefit the society by developing strategies to prevent family disruption in our country.

1. To evaluate the latest National Family Health Survey result trends for the State and districts (if available) and chalk out feasible research strategies to address the most relevant issues
2. To understand the burden and aetiology of problems in the family set up and develop counselling facilities for addressing family problems
3. To study feasible intervention strategies within the family context so as to enable the Government to make modifications in various programs
4. To collaborate with local community based organisations and government services in strengthening the institution of family by capacity building of grass-root level care givers.
5. To develop supportive services in parenting and child care issues.
6. To assess the risk factors in family breakdown and to develop strategies to manage the process of divorce/separation in the best interest of children.
7. To develop Specialised Family Violence Services which aim to assist vulnerable families

Engineering Branch

I. Details of staff and duties

a. University Engineer

Head of the Engineering wing of the University. Responsible for the implementation of all infrastructure development works of the university including checking of plan and estimates, checking of tender documents, site supervision, checking of work bills etc. and all related matters including liaisoning with the accredited implementing agencies.

b. Site Engineer (civil)

Responsible for the works in connection with preparation of plan and estimates, tender documents, site supervision, preparation of work bills etc. and all related matters connected with the civil works executed by the university. Also functions as the Estate Officer of the university.

c. Site Engineer (electrical)

Responsible for the preparation of plan and estimates, tender documents, site supervision, preparation of work bills etc. and all related matters connected with the electrical works executed by the university including maintenance of HVAC systems, Elevator, generator and fire fighting installations in the university.

II. Details of Infrastructure works during the year.

A. New infrastructure projects taken up during 2017-18.

1. Construction of Building for School of Research in Ayurveda at Thripunithura-Phase-II

Ayurveda is the most ancient system of medicine, and it flourished in India as the most effective system of treatment. For Ayurveda to be promoted as a source of health care, it is crucial to promote efforts to identify the safest and most effective therapy and their rationale use. This necessitates intensive research in all fields of Ayurveda ie. Fundamental research, drug research, pharmaceutical research and clinical research. To achieve this objective, KUHS decided to establish a school of research in Thrippunithura .

KUHS entrusted the planning, design and execution of the project with M/s FIT, Aluva.M/s FIT appointed M/s Pithavadian & Partners, Chennai as their consultants. The building is designed as a nine storied building (G+8) with a total plinth area of 10994 m2.

Government accorded Administrative sanction for constructing two floors of the building as initial phase vide G.O (Rt) No.3466/2015/H&FWD dated 20-10-2015 for an amount of Rs.746 lakhs. The execution of the work has commenced and is expected to be completed by the end of march2018.

For making the building functional the balance works are also to be arranged. Hence it was proposed to take up the execution of Phase-II of the project utilising the allotment provided in the state budget for 2017-18 as grant in aid. Under Phase-II, it was proposed to take up the construction of structural work of remaining floors(second to ninth) and to construct the

brick masonry walls and it's plastering up to fifth floor. The estimate amounting to Rs. 1360 Lakhs was prepared for the purpose and the Government accorded Administrative sanction for the same and the tender process is being done by the consultants, M/s FIT Aluva.

2. Construction of Building for School of Health Policy and Planning at

Thiruvananthapuram

The University has decided to set up a school_of Health Policy and Planning studies at Thiruvananthapuram with the intension of creating a health data base and for starting initiatives for bringing out a sound health policy and to achieve excellence in delivery of quality health services. The school is expected to strengthen capacity building for improved health policy planning, advocacy and governance. The school is expected to facilitate sound health care practices and policies by enabling all stakeholders in health care delivery to make informed decisions by synthesizing and interpreting available evidence and by carrying out new research efforts to fill in gaps in existing knowledge.

The required land has been allotted by the Government and also accorded Administrative sanction for the work amounting to Rs.650 lakh. The construction of the building has been entrusted with CPWD and the work is expected to be tendered by the end of March 2019.

3. Establishment of Solar power plant.

Our Energy consumption is of the order of 34,000 units per month as of now. This may increase to about 50,000 units once the Evaluation centre becomes operational. By using the proposed solar power plant of 200 KWp we can generate about 40,000units (average) per month. The approximate cost for establishing a 200KWp solar power plant without battery will be Rs.3 Crore. The initial investment will be recovered in about 5 -6 years or so.

We have identified a site suitable for installing solar power plants to generate approximate 200 KWp solar power. We can install a 200 KWp solar plant without battery, and grid-connected system. As our major energy consumption is in day time, we can avoid battery bank and can reduce the cost of the same. A Detailed Project Report envisaging a cost of Rs.161 lakh for the purpose was prepared and Government accorded Administrative sanction for the same. Kerala State Electricity Board Ltd has been selected as our Technical Consultant for the project and they had finalized the tender process. The execution is expected to commence by the end of February 2029 with a period of completion of 9 months.

4. Academic Complex, KUHS Campus, Thrissur

The University has decided to establish an academic staff college in the main campus at Thrissur and has also established eight centres for felicitating higher studies and research in various fields of medicine. It is decided to construct a building to accommodate the staff college and the eight centres.

CPWD was entrusted with the creation of the required building including preparation of plan and its execution. Accordingly, they had prepared the design of a six storied building having a plinth area of 9689 m² incorporating all the requirements. The estimated cost of the building including cost of furniture is Rs.45 crore. University's own funds is being used for the construction. Govt. has accorded Administrative sanction for the work for an amount of Rs.45 crore. The construction of the building is in progress.

B. Ongoing and Completed projects during the year 2017-18.

1. The construction of building for the Utility Centre

A new building to accommodate the bank, post office, canteen, student's union office, a mini conference hall, dining space for staff and two guest rooms, etc. with a total plinth area of 1945 m² is being constructed in the campus. The building with an estimated cost of Rs.856 lakh is being constructed utilising the Grant in aid provided by the State Government. CPWD is the implementing agency. The work is expected to be completed by the end of August 2018.

2. Construction of Type-II Staff quarters

The University has its main campus located at Mulamkunnathukavu which is at a distance of about 13 km from Thrissur town. Considering the persistent demand for more staff quarters, the construction of a block of Type-II Quarters housing six units was taken up during the year 2016-17. Administrative Sanction was accorded by the Government for the Project costing Rs.191 lakh. Kerala Public Works Department is the executing agency and construction is progressing fast.

3. Establishment of Senate hall in the Administrative block

The senate hall is to be established in the seventh floor of the University Building. The approximate area for the senate hall is 672m² with a provision for accommodating 240 seats. Separate green room for ladies and gents, acoustic wall panel, false ceiling in senate hall, laminated wooden flooring, auditorium chairs, auditorium tables, flash doors platform for main area and stage using MS angles section and BWP Marian ply 18 mm thick etc are provided. Internal electrification and lighting arrangements and modern AV Systems are also provided. The project with an outlay of Rs.341 Lakh was carried out by M/s HLL Ltd. The execution of the work was completed in March 2018.

4. Construction of Mezzanine floor in the Administrative block and improving the ventilation system in the administrative block.

The project is intended to construct mezzanine floors in the wings of the Administrative Block, to provide additional storage space. For providing adequate ventilation in the third and fourth floor, it was decided to install ventilating fan in the central atrium. The project cost is Rs.53 lakh. Administrative Sanction was accorded by the Government, utilising the budget allocation for the year 2016-17. The execution of the work is in progress and is expected to be completed by the end of June 2018.

5. Construction of Building for School of Family Health studies at Kozhikode

The KUHS has decided to set up a school of Family Health studies at Kozhikode for addressing family health in all its dimensions by developing strategies to promote family as the most important social unit for human survival and development. The school is expected to adequately address the family health issues of the society and will also facilitate developing comprehensive service models in improving health of individuals, families and communities by working together to understand, teach, counsel and lead the whole community for healthy living and lifestyles.

The required land for construction of a building for the school was allotted in the Government Medical College campus and the Government also accorded Administrative Sanction for constructing the building for an amount of Rs.714.37 lakh. The execution has been entrusted with Kerala Public Works Department and the work is in progress.

C. New Projects planned for the year 2018-19.

1. Construction of Type-III and Type-II Staff quarters

Considering the persistent demand for more staff quarters, it has been decided to construct a block each of Type-II Quarters and Type-III Quarters, each housing six units during the year 2018-19. The project cost is estimated to cost Rs.423 lakhs.

2. Construction of Sewage Treatment Plant

The University has its main campus located in the land allotted by Government in the Medical college campus at Mulamkunnathukavu, Thrissur. The main building, Valuation centre and staff quarters are located in this campus. The construction of utility building in the campus is nearing completion. All these buildings are provided with independent septic tanks and soak pits. But the soil in this area consists of impermeable hard laterite and hence the effluents from the septic tanks are not absorbed by the soak pits and are overflowing, resulting in the collection of waste water in the soak pit area. This is highly unhygienic and is posing health hazards. Only solution is to establish Treatment plants for treating the Sewage.

It is proposed to establish two sewage treatment plants, one of the capacity 30 CMD for the Administrative block and another of 70 CMD for the valuation centre and the utility block. It is proposed to adopt Moving Bed Bio Reactor (MBBR) technology for the Sewage Treatment plants. The total project cost is estimated at Rs.75 lakh.

3 Construction of the building for the School of Research in Ayurveda at Thripunithura-Phase-III.

Government accorded Administrative sanction for constructing two floors of the building, Phase-I for an amount of Rs.746 lakh and Phase-II for an amount of Rs.1360 lakh. Under Phase-II, it is proposed to take up the construction of structural work of remaining floors(second to ninth) and to construct the brick masonry walls and it's plastering up to fifth floor. For making the building functional the balance works are also to be arranged simultaneously for the following reasons.

Even if the construction of the Phase-II of the building is completed it cannot be put to use and the investment made will remain infructuous. Hence it is proposed to take up the execution of Phase-III of the project utilising the allotment provided in state budget. The provisions included in Phase-III is for carrying out the balance civil works, sanitary and water supply works, electrification, construction of septic tank, overhead water tank etc. to make the entire building occupational.

The estimate amount is expected to be Rs. 950 Lakh

4. Construction of an Auditorium

It has been decided to construct an auditorium of the capacity of 4260 seats in the campus utilising the savings amount from the Construction of the Utility Building and of the academic block building. Central Public Works Department has been selected as the implementing agency and the construction is expected to commence in the year 2018-19.

ORGANISATIONAL STRUCTURE - 2017-18

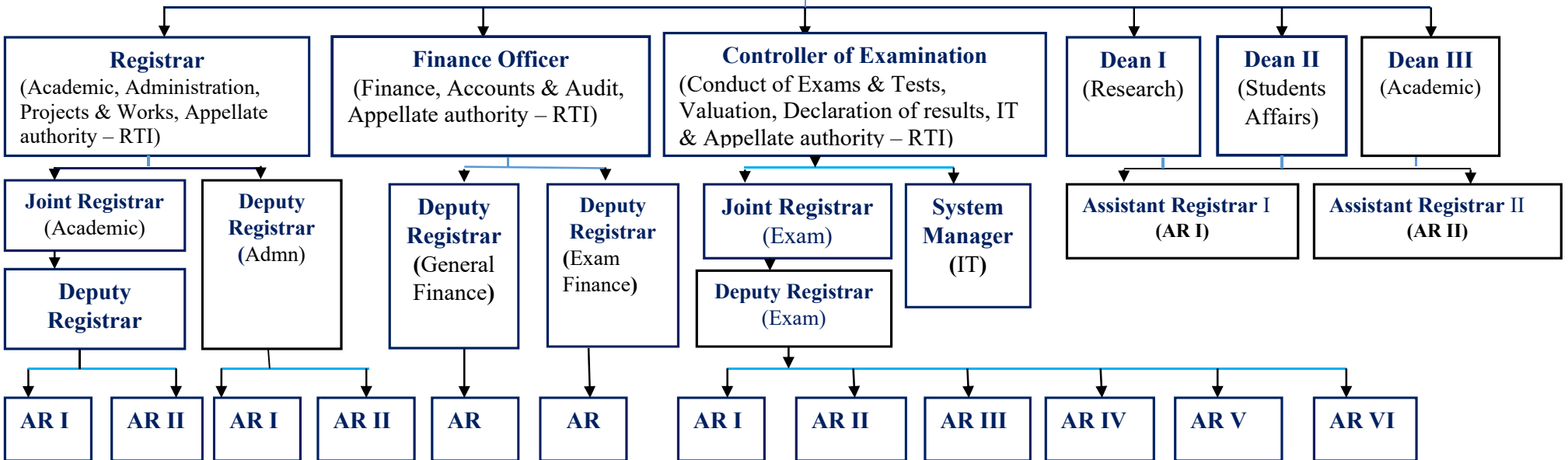
