Annual Report **2012-13**

INTRODUCTION

The Kerala University of Health Sciences completed yet another year in the service of health sciences, healthcare and the people of the State – a year of rapid progress and development in all its spheres of activity. Nine new colleges- *one* in Modern Medicine, *six* in Nursing and *two* in Allied Health Sciences - were affiliated during the period. A total of 595 examinations in Undergraduate and postgraduate courses were successfully conducted, maintaining absolute confidentiality and promptness. The Finance & Accounts Section completed its internal organization for the efficient and transparent management and financial transactions in the University. The section also gave appropriate advices to the University Management wherever necessary. The University received Rs 9.94 Crore as Plan Grant for infrastructure developments and Rs 3.45 crore as Non-Plan grant in the current year. The latter, however, was grossly insufficient to meet the salary and non-salary commitments, the short-fall being met from internal resources of the University. The functioning of Finance section is expected to be further stream-lined with automation next year. The Research Division initiated a series of steps to establish a research ecosystem in the affiliated colleges of the University. These included seminars, symposia, workshops and focused training programmes for both faculty and post graduate students in dissertation writing, project preparation and in scientific journalism. The ICMR-KUHS and the BMJ-KUHS joint exercises were particularly worth mentioning. All the disciplines of health sciences were covered in the programmes. In addition, training programmes were conducted for college inspectors. A MoU was signed with the National University of Advanced Legal Studies, and another one is on the anvil with the Kerala Institute of Local Administration, for joint academic and research programmes of professional and societal relevance. Despite not being able to constitute the Student Councils because of the absence of the statutes, the University was able to conduct inter-collegiate competitions in sports, games and cultural fields. In order to facilitate maximum participation, the affiliated colleges were divided into

geographical groups. All competitions were held at the zonal levels, culminating at the inter-zonal all Kerala level. Judging by the enthusiastic participation of all stake-holders, including the general public, and efficient organization, the first ever co-curricular events were a great success. The University was also successful in ensuring stake-holder involvement in all major policy changes in academic and administrative matters.

The University has endeavored to achieve the targets it has set for itself in the year under review. Not only was the unification of the Colleges which were scattered under five different Universities in the State until a little over a year ago, was completed successfully, but several measures to improve the academic standards and enhance research were also effectively put in place during the past year. A beginning was made to commence co-curricular activities. Their success marked the launching of the University on all co-curricular fronts. However, the absence of the University Statutes remained a major stumbling block. It is expected that the Government of Kerala will soon issue the first Statutes and the onward march of the Kerala University of Health Sciences would continue unhampered for years to come.

Vision & Mission

The Vision of the University is to enrich the art and science of health care through research, incorporation of traditional knowledge, and integration of best practices; to produce competent and compassionate professionals who are heirs to the rich traditions of the world of science and ancient wisdom; and to engage with the society to address health problems and issues of the State.

Mission

1. Ensure high quality education in all branches of health care so as to produce competent, compassionate and socially committed professionals through a variety of measures including adhering to academic calendars, timely conduct of examinations, regular updating of syllabi and curriculum to incorporate new knowledge and best practices, and teachers' training.
2. Encourage Research by establishing University schools of research, identifying and promoting institutions/departments as centres of potential excellence and nurturing a mindset and aptitude for research among students.

3. Promote stake holder participation & community empowerment through, among others, setting up efficient and transparent administrative mechanisms which are responsive and responsible, promotion of health awareness programmes and helping the Government in formulating health policy and plans.

Highlights of the Year...

- Successfully stream-lined the affiliation of 229 Colleges transferred from the 5 previous Universities; 9 new Colleges affiliated
- 595 UG and PG examinations were completed flawlessly
- ICMR-KUHS and KUHS-BMJ workshops on research methodology and on writing articles in indexed journals
- The on-line open access journal “Health Sciences” commenced publication, a first of its kind in Kerala
- Faculty with interest in research were identified and their projects were submitted to funding agencies
- MoU signed with NUALS; another MoU with KILA on the anvil.
- An advocacy document on Social Determinants of Health was handed over to the Govt. of Kerala
- Co-curricular activities were launched with re-sounding success.
- Ensured wide-ranging stake-holder consultations before finalising new policies, particularly in academic matters.

Report from the Registrar

Dr. Ipe Varghese was the Registrar during the period of the Report. He reports to the Vice Chancellor. The following are the major activities

1. *Orientation Programme to the Post Graduate students.*

Orientation programmes were conducted for the 1st year Post Graduate students on Research Methodology and dissertation protocol. Post Graduate students of all the Faculties were given such training.

2. Workshop for inspectors.

Workshop for senior members of the faculty were held in all streams on how to conduct inspection on receiving requests for affiliation of new colleges and new courses, enhancement of seats and continuation of affiliation.

3. **A memorandum of Understanding** was signed with the National University of Advanced Legal Studies on 26 December 2012: The main objects of the MoU are the establishment of scientific exchange and co-operation for enhancing knowledge and expertise, and the advancement of human welfare in its broadest sense, to promote mutual cooperation in the area of education and research between the universities and to work together for the purpose of building knowledge and skills in the domain of the legal aspects of health. The Universities will strive towards jointly designing, developing and conducting courses, training programmes, research, seminars and other vehicles of knowledge generation and dissemination.

4. During this period Governing council met four times (15/05/2012, 17/08/2012, 01/12/2012, and 08/03/2013) routinely and once (05/01/2013) as an extraordinary one. The 10th GC meeting held on 01/12/2012 decided on 'proactive interventions to improve the academic performance of affiliated colleges'. This included sharing the experiences of colleges performing consistently well and developing academic supports to colleges at the other end. The Academic council met twice – on 15/11/2012 and 06/03/2013.

Incentives for toppers in University examinations of all UG courses (fee waiver), PG students getting published in scientific journals (fee waiver) and UG students reading scientific journals (attendance) were noteworthy decisions. The fee waivers were given to university winners in all sports and art items also.

Various academic bodies also had their meetings regularly.

5. Registrations of students were made online and ID cards were issued to all students. On the cutoff date for admission as per the regulations of the statutory councils, the colleges register their students online with basic data. Within three months, they are given time slots for verifying the certificates following which registration process is completed.

Report from the Controller of Examinations

Dr. P.K. Sudhir is the Controller of Examinations. He reports to the Vice Chancellor Kerala University of Health Sciences (KUHS) is offering 16 UG, 99 PG and 16 super specialty programmes under the Faculties of Allied Health Science, Ayurveda, Dental Science, Homoeopathy, Medicine, Nursing and Pharmacy. From the beginning itself, the University decided to conduct the examinations and publish the results on time, thus avoiding the prevailing “course lag” in different health care professional courses in Kerala. Prompt and timely conduct of examination and publication of results are undoubtedly major steps to ensure the quality of the KUHS degrees.

Examination and evaluation being the primary responsibility of any university, KUHS was able to set certain **“Gold Standards”** to achieve prompt conducting of the examinations and the publishing of results.

The key features are:

- Ø Preparation and publication of examination calendar at the beginning of the academic year, thus faculty and students can effectively organize their teaching-learning programs from the beginning.
- Ø Notification of examinations at least 45 days prior to the commencement of the examination for proper planning.
- Ø An examination committee is constituted exclusively for each examination
- Ø Approval of KUHS theory examination centres only if the prescribed specifications are met by the concerned affiliated colleges, namely two internet connections, printer, copier, fax machine, generator backup etc. for secure and assured delivery of question papers transmitted online .
- Ø Preparation of question paper bank with the help of a panel of experts from the national level, which would be scrutinized by the state level experts before depositing in the question paper bank in order to help eliminate any errors.
- Ø Choice-less question papers, since university conducts only health science courses
- Ø Online entry of internal marks and attendance from the colleges to reduce any error and malpractices.
- Ø Class average of the internal assessment marks is restricted to 75% to prevent unwanted boosting of internal marks from the college level.
- Ø Online distribution of admit cards from the colleges to avoid logistic issues.
- Ø 52 pages and 32 pages, single, bar-coded, theory answer books which are tamper proof and more student-friendly.
- Ø Secure delivery of question papers online to all the theory examination centers 30 minutes prior to the commencement of the examination, thus reducing logistic difficulties as well preventing any manipulation. No candidates are permitted to the examination hall after the question paper transmission.

- Ø Online uploading of a correction file which may include replacement/ modification/ correction of questions, within 15 minutes of the commencement of the examination, if there are any errors and/or deviation from the prescribed syllabi.
- Ø Identifying a nodal centre for each theory examination and appointing a nodal officer for each examination and subject experts for the examination concerned for smooth co-ordination between the chief superintendent and the university. Subject expert appointed on the day of examination shall review the question paper before distributing the question papers and recommend if there is any replacement/modification/correction to the university.
- Ø Appointment of observers for theory examinations from other health science streams, for human surveillance.
- Ø CCTV surveillance in all theory examination centers and chief superintendent of examination shall send the recorded DVD proceedings of the day of examination to the university along with the theory answer books.
- Ø Installation of mobile jammer in all theory examination centers to prevent copying by electronic means
- Ø Online uploading of details of candidates who are present or absent, within 30 minutes of commencement of the examination from all theory examination centers.
- Ø Double evaluation of all theory papers for all UG courses and the average of the both being taken as the final mark. If there is a variation of more than 15% of the total marks between the first and second valuation, a compulsory third valuation shall be done and average of the nearer two marks shall be taken as the final mark, thus making the system more scientific and valid. Multiple evaluations are done in all PG and super specialty courses and the average of the marks from them shall be taken as the final mark. There is no revaluation of theory papers for any of the examinations; only re-totalling.
- Ø Centralized evaluation camps for theory papers for all UG courses. Theory marks are uploaded online from the camp itself.
- Ø Online uploading of the practical marks from all the practical examination centres on the day of examination itself by the both internal and external examiners, in presence of the chairperson of the practical examination.

- Ø Publication of examination results on the KUHS website within 24 hours after the pass board recommendations are approved.
- Ø IT enabled examination system developed in-house, which is totally secure and devoid of human errors and malpractices.
- Ø Enhanced and prompt remuneration to all examination related duties for making the system more efficient.
- Ø Previous university question papers are published in the university website for students' reference.

Thus KUHS examination system has been made fully automated, efficient, reliable, valid, time bounded, student-friendly and totally tamper proof. The first batch of post graduate courses in Medicine, Nursing, Physiotherapy, Speech therapy, Hospital Administration and also the Post Basic nursing were completed successfully within the stipulated time.

In the academic year 2012-13, the university conducted 595 examinations out of which 286 were regular and 209 were supplementary examinations. Even though examination department is suffering from the infrastructure and manpower constraints, department is able to conduct the examination and publish the results on time, thus avoiding any course lag.

The future plans of KUHS examination system:

- Ø E-evaluation of theory papers to reduce the logistic issues of evaluation.
- Ø Biometric finger print reader in all theory and practical examination centers to prevent impersonation.
- Ø NKN connectivity to all affiliated colleges, thus making the system more secure, effective and economical.

Report from Dean Research

Dr. Praveenlal Kuttichira is the Dean of Research. He reports to the Vice Chancellor.

The initiatives of the section began in 2012. First attempt was to locate faculty with interest in doing research. All the colleges affiliated to University under different streams were approached. Middle and lower level faculty members were given priority. The goal was to generate ideas, encourage teaming-up and developing research protocols. Study groups were formed for public health (4 faculties), medical education (4 faculty members), fever studies (3 faculty members), mental health (4 faculty members), basic

sciences (8 faculty members), women and child (4 faculty members), health and economics (3 faculty members), gender studies (4 faculty members), homeopathy (5 faculty members) and Ayurveda (9 faculty members). 42 research questions were generated in these 10 meetings. By the end of one year, three protocols remain submitted to ICMR; four studies remain completed and one study is ongoing. Three manuscripts were submitted for publication and one has been accepted already.

For the maximum participation of students, the colleges were divided into three zones for cultural festivals. They were North Zone (colleges of Kasargode, Kannur, Wayanad, Kozhikode and Malapuram), Central Zone (Palakkad, Thrissur, Ernakulam, Idukki and Kottayam) and South Zone (Alapuzha, Pathanamthitta, Kollam and Thiruvananthapuram).

CENTRAL ZONE

Central zone consists of 81 colleges. Logo for the fest was invited from students of affiliated colleges; many entries were received and one of them was finalized.

On 5/12/12 the logo was officially released by Smt. **Methil Devika** a well-known dancer.

The competitions of the fest started on the 19th morning. The host college **Ahalia Ayurveda Medical College, Palakkad** was the central zone winners with 76 points; **PNNM Ayurveda Medical College, Shornur** with 75 points became the runners up, and **Padiyar Memorial Homoeopathic Medical College, Chottanikara** came the third with 46 points.

NORTH ZONE

The inaugural function of SAMSKRITI was held on 17/01/2013 at Parasinikadavu Ayurveda Medical college auditorium.

Parasinikadavu Ayurveda Medical College was the winners of the overall trophy and runners up were Govt. Ayurveda College, Kannur, & Pariyaram Medical college.

SOUTH ZONE FEST

On 1/02/2013 the programme started with Mohiniyattumon. Travancore Medical College, Kollam was the overall champions and Govt. Medical College Trivandrum was the runner up.

FENESTRA was success judging by the enthusiastic and disciplined participation of all colleges.

INTER ZONE FEST 2013

The official inauguration of the Inter zone fest 2013 was on 30/05/2013 at PNNM Ayurveda College.

PNNM Ayurveda Medical College became the first Inter zone champions with 55 points. The first runner up was **Ahalia Ayurveda College** Palakkad with 54 points, the 2nd runner up was **Parasinikadavu Ayurveda College** with 46 points followed by Govt. Medical College Calicut and Dr. Padiar Homoeopathy College Ernakulam. **Amritha Aravind** of ACME Pariyaram was Kalathilakam, Sri **KS Harisanker** of PMS Dental College, Thiruvanthapuram was Kalaprathibha and Sargaprathibha was shared by **Sanju K Sreeraj** of Dr SM CSI Medical Karakkonam and **Dona M Jose** of St Joseph's Nursing College Ernakulam. Government Medical College Calicut was the champions for the 2012-13 games tournament, Dr SM CSI Medical college Karakkonam was the runnerup. The first inter zone fest was a grand success by its disciplined organization, the wonderful hospitality of PNNM College and the active participation of students from all streams of colleges. The minus point was the less number of participation from the selected candidates, particularly from south zone. There were no complaints about food and accommodation and even the appeals were less and that too finalized cordially by the committee.

Report from the Finance Officer:

The Finance & Accounts Section is headed by Shri.G.Gopakumar, Finance Officer. The Finance Officer reports to the Vice Chancellor and functions under the guidance of Finance Committee chaired by the Vice Chancellor.

The Finance & Accounts Branch deals with the Budget (Plan & Non-plan) proposals to the Government, Funds management, Treasury and Bank transactions, all

receipts and payments, Project Accounts, Internal audit, Statutory audit, Statutory remittances and filing of returns and preparation of Annual Financial Statements. The following Sections are functioning in Finance & Accounts Branch:

- Bills & Accounts Section
- Internal Audit Section
- Examination Finance (Cash & CV Camp) Section
- Examination Finance (Advance & settlements) Section

Each Section is headed by a Section Officer under overall supervision of Deputy Registrar (F & A).

The Annual Financial Statements of the University is being prepared under double entry system and following accrual basis of accounting, which consists of Receipts & Payments Account, Income & Expenditure Account and Balance Sheet.

The Bills and Accounts section deals with Cash/Bank Receipts and Payments, Remittance of statutory dues, Accounting of receipts & expenditure and preparation of Annual Accounts and Budget, Establishment/contingent bills, TA and other claims, settlement of advances to staff, purchases and work bills and transactions related to constituent Institutions. The Annual accounts are prepared on Double entry basis, on historical cost convention and on accrual method of accounting. The Budget is prepared under four main parts viz: Receipts–Non-plan, Expenditure Non-Plan, Receipts–Plan and Expenditure–Plan.

The Internal Audit section deals with accounting of receipts in respect of Affiliation, Students Registration and Examination fees, pre-check of work bills, internal check of Bank/Cash transactions, reconciliation, Fixed Asset Register, Verification of Stock and Assets, and Internal Audit of Examination related payments-advances and settlement of CV camp expenses.

The Examination Finance (Cash & CV camp) section deals with examination related cash/bank expenses and Accounts, camp valuation and general confidential payments.

The Examination Finance (Advance and settlement) section deals with settlement of advances given to constituent institutions for conducting examinations.

The University is receiving Grant-in-aid from Government of Kerala under 'Plan' for creation of Campus Infrastructure, IT Infrastructure and establishment of Schools and Institutions. The University is also receiving 'Non-Plan Grants' for meeting part of salary

and Non-salary expenses, since the Grant-in-aid is not sufficient for meeting these expenses. The University has received Plan funds to the extent of Rs.9.94 crore for infrastructure creation and Rs.3.45 crore as Non-plan grant. The revenues of the University mainly comprise various fee received from affiliated colleges for affiliation related services, fee received for Students Registration and Examination fee.

Report from the Project Director

Shri S. Narayanankutty is the consultant Project Director. He reports to the Registrar.

Construction of Administrative Office: The Administrative office of Kerala University of Health Sciences is an eight-storeyed RCC building having a plinth area of 13480.62 Sqm.

The construction work of the building was awarded to M/S HLL Life Care Ltd, Thiruvananthapuram on nomination basis at a total cost of Rs.24.6 Crores and they in turn entrusted the work to M/S Cherian Varkey Construction Company, Kochi. They commenced the work on 06/02/2012. The piling work for the building was completed in March 2012 and the work of pile cap, plinth beams and column footings started in April 2012. By May of 2012, part of superstructure works also commenced. The first floor slab casting was done on 11/07/2012 and work progressed to complete the structural work of ground and six upper floors by the beginning of January 2013. By the end of March 2013 work of the entire structure was completed except the front portion of the seventh floor roof and the two wings. During this period construction of the outer brick wall also was taken up and completed up to 5th floor. The total expenditure incurred up to the end of 2012-13 was Rs.8.5 Crores.
