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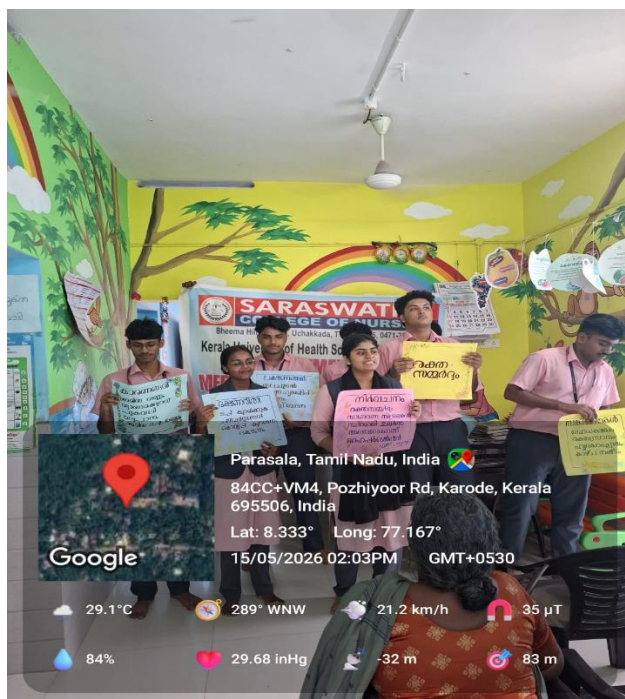

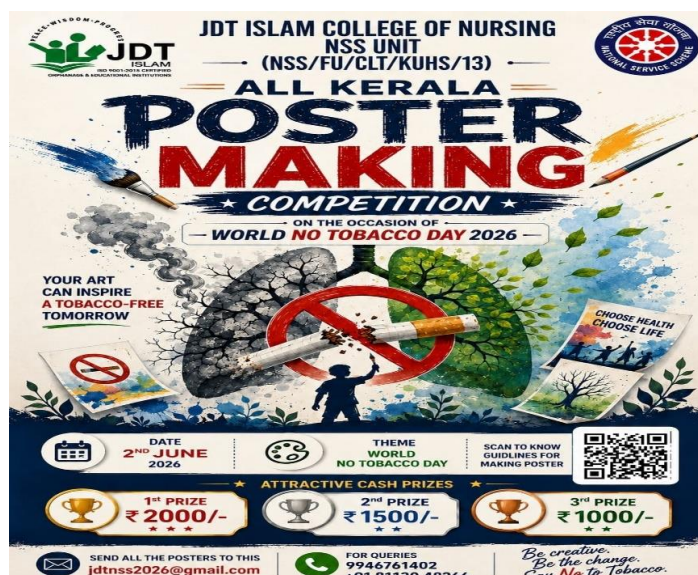
The programme concluded with a photo session, marking the successful observance of World Environment Day and reinforcing the importance of environmental stewardship among the participants.

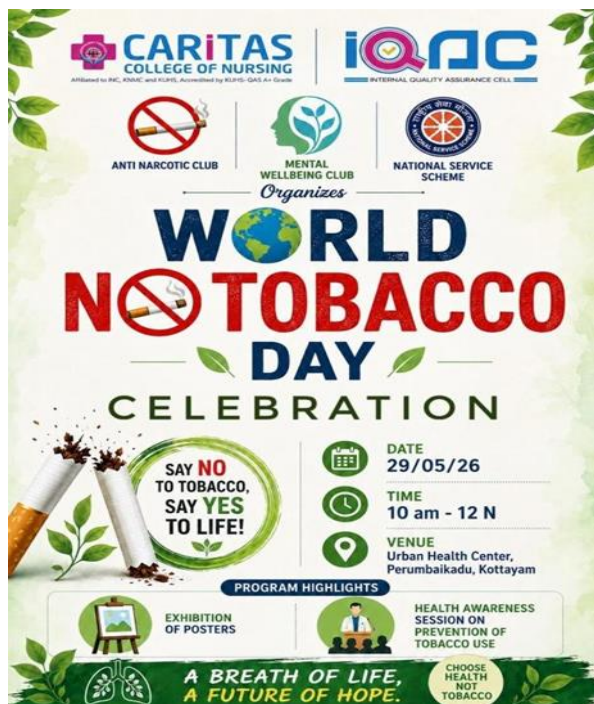

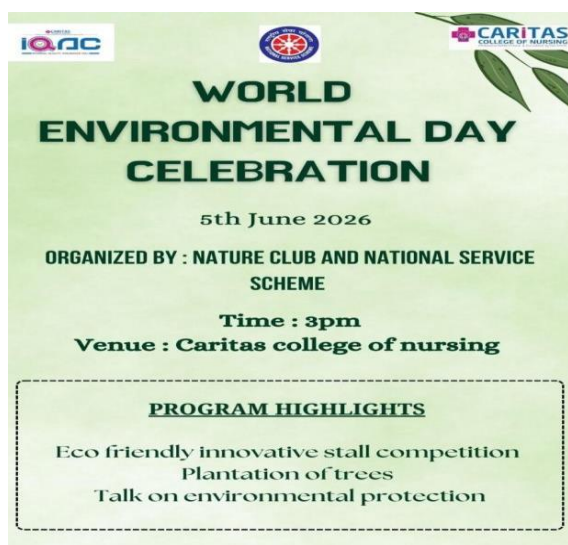

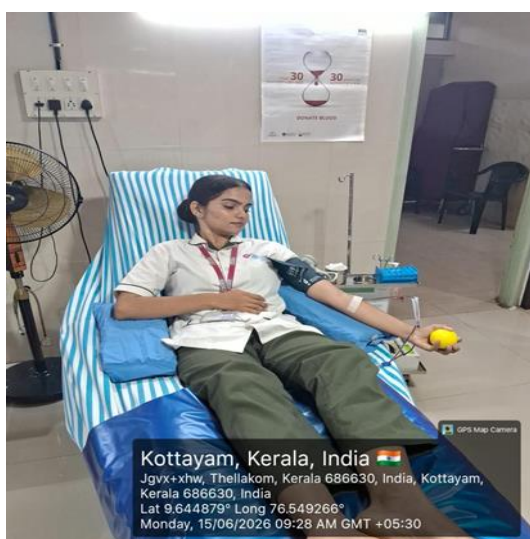

Following that nurse lead clinic was started. 5 stations were arranged for registration , Checking Blood pressure ,assessing blood sugar and BMI calculation and the last station was reference station, only if needed, to UPHC Kachery .and also to check whether the referred patients go for consultation and follow up the care. 43 token were given for the public. Among 43 members, 2 were referred to UPHC, Kachery. Refreshment were arranged for the public and NSS volunteers.

7.Green campus initiative

The **Green Campus Initiative** was implemented at our institution with the objective of promoting **environmental sustainability, ecological awareness, and responsible practices** among students and staff. Recreational activities like music and newspaper reading were provided.

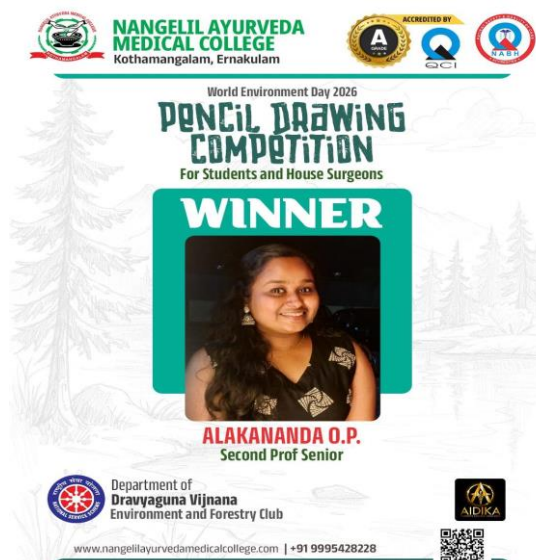

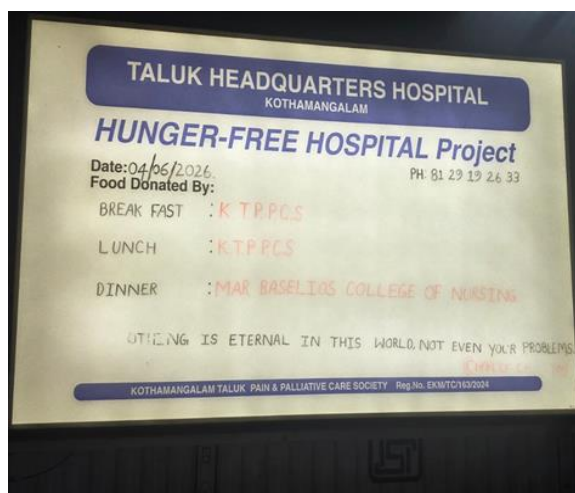
29.05.2026 REPORT ON WORLD NO TOBACCO DAY AWARENESS PROGRAM

2. World Hair Donation Day – Awareness Programme

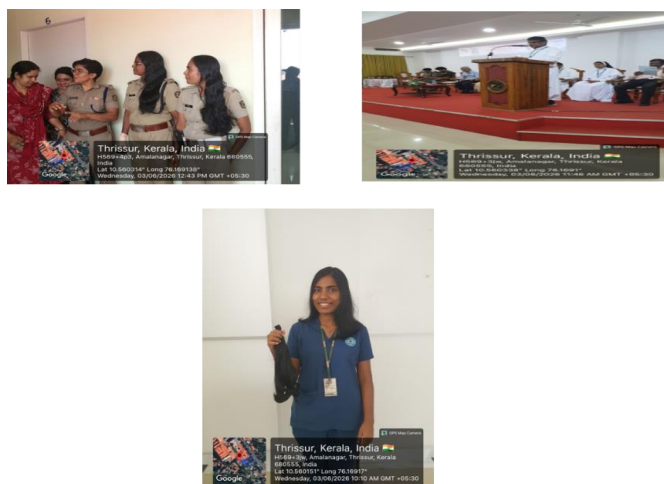

Venue: Amala RHTC and Velur Panchayath

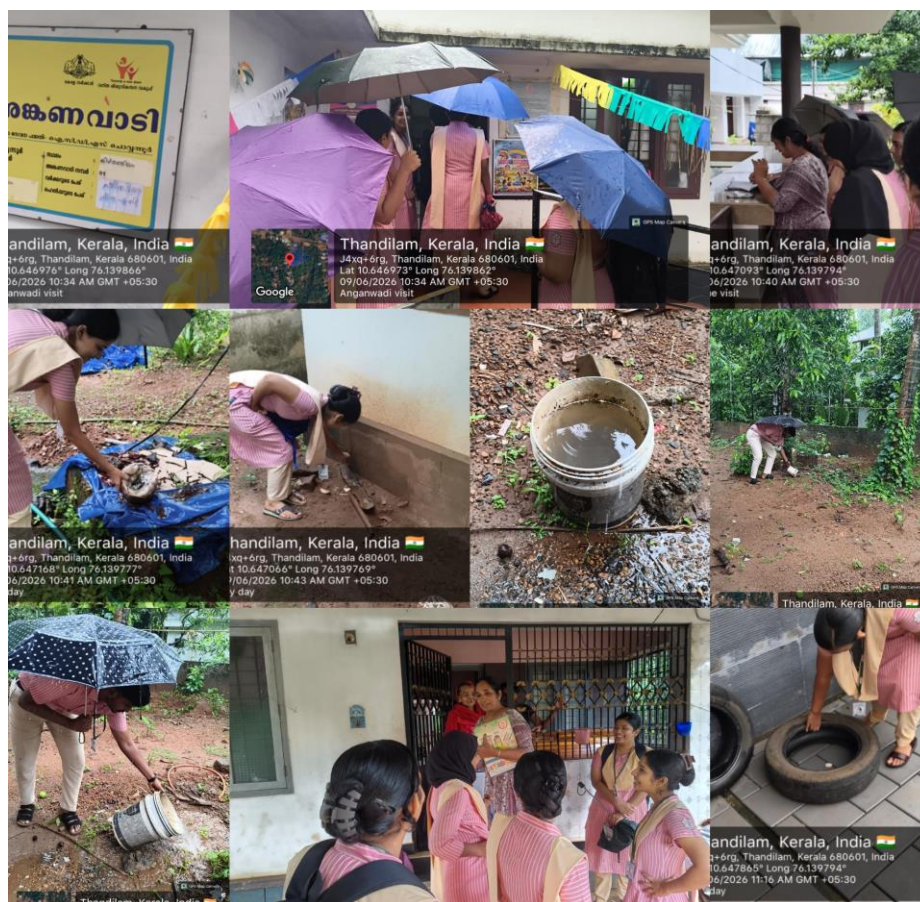

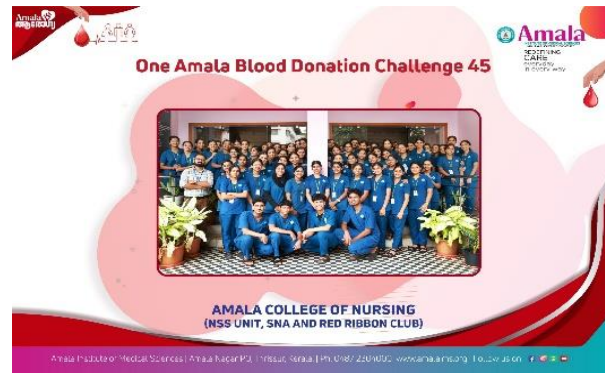
