



REPORT ON DENTAL SCREENING CAMP

Report on Menstrual Cup Awareness Class

On 26th August 2025, the NSS Unit of Baby Memorial College of Nursing (BMCON) in collaboration with the Department of Obstetrics and Gynecology organized a special awareness programme on menstrual hygiene and menstrual cup usage. The session began with an educational class on the menstrual cup, highlighting its benefits such as cost-effectiveness, eco-friendliness, and health safety compared to disposable sanitary products. Following the class, free menstrual cups were distributed to the students, enabling them to practice sustainable menstrual hygiene management. The session was led by Ms. Noureen, Femisafe company and distributed menstrual cups to all the Co-Founder. students of BMH academy. To promote empathy and awareness among all genders, male students were given the opportunity to try a "menstrual cramp simulator". This activity helped them understand the discomfort and challenges faced by women during menstruation. The programme was well received by both male and female students. The initiative encouraged open discussions on menstrual health and emphasized the importance of adopting eco-friendly practices. The combined efforts of the NSS volunteers and the Department of OBG made the event successful, impactful, and educational. About 360 students benefitted from this session.





JDT ISLAM COLLEGE OF PHYSIOTHERAPY
