

DETAILED REPORT ON WORLD STROKE DAY AWARENESS PROGRAMME

Organized by: NSS Unit, JDT Islam College of Physiotherapy

Date: 30th October 2025

Venue: JDT Islam College of Physiotherapy, Vellimadukunnu & Calicut Beach, Kozhikode

The NSS Unit of JDT Islam College of Physiotherapy conducted a World Stroke Day Awareness Programme on 30 October 2025 at the Government Old Age Home, Kozhikode. A total of 28 elderly residents participated in the programme, which aimed to spread awareness on stroke prevention, early identification, and the role of physiotherapy in rehabilitation.

PROGRAMME HIGHLIGHTS:

The programme began with an introduction to the significance of World Stroke Day. NSS volunteers and PG students delivered informative sessions using PowerPoint presentations and visual charts. The awareness sessions covered early warning signs of stroke (FAST), risk factors such as hypertension and diabetes, preventive lifestyle strategies, and home-based mobility exercises.

ACTIVITIES CONDUCTED:

- Stroke awareness class by NSS volunteers.
- Physiotherapy screening and basic treatment as required.
- Demonstration of balance, strengthening, breathing, and mobility exercises.
- Presentation of educational videos for better understanding.
- Interactive discussion and feedback session with residents.

TEAM INVOLVEMENT:

The programme was coordinated by NSS volunteers—Minnath, Malavika, Anjana, Raziq, Ihthisham, Revathy, Rejin, and Tinu—along with PG students who actively engaged in conducting sessions, demonstrations, and assessments.

OUTCOME:

The session successfully enhanced awareness among the elderly about stroke prevention and early recognition. Residents appreciated the exercises and guidance provided. The Old Age Home authorities expressed gratitude for conducting a meaningful health programme.

CONCLUSION:



GLOBAL HAND WASHING DAY CELEBRATION

On October 15th, in observance of Global Handwashing Day, an awareness program was successfully organized by the National Service Scheme (NSS) unit of the Institute of Nursing Sciences and Research, Malabar Cancer Centre, in collaboration with the 6th semester students. 




10. Immunization Day Awareness Programme


The programme was highly informative and successful in creating awareness about the evolving landscape of Indian education.


