It is hereby notified the following amendment to the following clauses of Course Regulations of BAMS, MD/MS AYURVEDA, B.S.M.S, B,U.M.S , BHMS and B.PT Courses being conducted by Kerala University of Health Sciences made by the 20th Academic Council meeting held on 21.03.2019 , as per Statute 1 of Chapter XXXVI of Kerala University of Health Sciences, which was approved by 52nd Governing Council meeting held on 11.04.2019 These amendments have been laid before the Senate held on 10.10.2019, as per Statute 3 of Chapter XXXVI of the Statutes 2013. These amendment shall come in to force with immediate effect..

Provided that the upper age limit may be relaxed by five years in the case of the Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes, Other Backward Classes and physically handicapped candidates.

(d). There shall be a uniform entrance examination for all medical institutions at the under-graduate level, namely the National Eligibility Entrance Test(NEET) for admission
